## **FOUR STEPS**

1. Establishment of mechanisms to involve older people in all stages of the Age-friendlyCities (AFC) process.

Cities are also encouraged to build partnerships with government and civil society (including nongovernmental organizations and academic institutions).

- 2. Development of a baseline assessment of the age-friendliness of the city. This assessment can be flexible to take into account the diversity of cities, however at a minimum, it needs to consider each of the eight domains identified in the WHO Age-friendly Cities Guide.
  - 1. outdoor spaces and buildings,
  - 2. transportation,
  - 3. housing,
  - 4. social participation.
  - 5. respect and social inclusion,
  - 6. civic participation and employment,
  - 7. communication and information, and
  - 8. community support and health services.
- 3. Development of a 3 year city-wide action plan based on the findings of this assessment.

It is anticipated that the action plan will link to other municipal instruments to ensure that agefriendliness becomes a core responsibility for all

4. Identification of indicators to monitor progress against this plan.

Please find attached an application form for the registration of the City of Warrnambool with the Global Network of Aged Friendly Cities.

Also attached is the Active Ageing Plan for Warrnambool 2008-2013 which outlines the commitment of Council to provide an age-friendly environment with specific actions around the implementation of the WHO Age Friendly Checklist in key areas.

As a result of this Plan Council has established a Working Party of community members who are determining priorities and the means by which progress can be benchmarked and measured. This Working Party has community membership drawn from a range of backgrounds and disciplines including health, social sciences, engineering and the private sector. All domains identified in the checklist have been given consideration in this process.

Over 83% of the recommendations included in the Active Ageing Plan have been completed across physical, built and natural environment; social environment; and the economic environment.

The City of Warrnambool will benefit greatly from being part of the global network and be able to share ways to ensure the provision of a natural, built, social and economic environment which is welcoming to all people, regardless of age.
