

Rating of Current Community as a Place for People to Live as They Age


Importance of Remaining in Current Community




54% of respondents say remaining in their current home is extremely/very important.

22% of respondents say they need to make major repairs, home modifications, or changes




City of Alexandria residents age 50+ have lived in their home for an average of 19 years and have lived in their community even longer, an average of 23 years.





About half of City of Alexandria residents age 50+ expect to stay in their home or community as they get older.








City of Alexandria residents age 50+ rate their community positively on having well-maintained homes and properties as well as good home modification and repair contractors.

transportation service






City of Alexandria residents age 50+ rate their community excellent to good on having well-maintained, safe streets and ample places to park.






City of Alexandria residents age 50+ feel their community offers convenient, well-maintained, safe, and affordable public transportation.






The majority of City of Alexandria residents age 50+ rate their community excellent to very good on having a variety of helpful and respectful health care professionals.






City of Alexandria residents age 50+ rate their community excellent to very good on having well-maintained and conveniently located health care facilities.






City of Alexandria residents age 50+ say their community has an excellent to good variety of affordable social activities at convenient locations.








The majority of City of Alexandria residents age 50+ rate their community positively on having access to a variety of volunteer activities that are easy to find.






City of Alexandria residents age 50+ are somewhat divided in their opinions on how well their community is doing in terms of having employment opportunities for older residents.








The majority of City of Alexandria residents age 50+ rate their community positively on having easy access to community information in one central source.

Survey Methodology:

- A telephone survey was commissioned by AARP to assess public opinion among City of Alexandria residents age 50+ about age-friendly and livable community topics in the City of Alexandria.
- Telephone interviewing was conducted by Alan Newman Research from July 15th to July 30th 2016.
- A total of 504 interviews were conducted. The margin of error for this sample is <u>+</u>4.4%.
- The sample utilized RDD landline and cell phone records.
