Japan is the most ageing country in the world and Hayama Town's population ratio of people aged 65 and over is estimated to be 31.3% in 2025.

In this situation, to develop a town where people can live happily with a smile as they get older, Hayama Town is implementing various measures valuing people's caring minds in their communities.

From the planning phase, communities and Hayama Town government work together exchanging opinions on welfare activities, and the Town government then encourages residents to work on their own, respecting communities' capabilities. In this way the Town promotes widely its preventive care programs led by residents' initiatives.

In addition, the government and long-term care insurance facilities work together from project planning to operation to build a community-based integrated care system that enables total services including medical, nursing care, preventing nursing care, housing and life support for people in need of support.
