



Nonsan's Strategy and Implementation Plan for Age-Friendly City



Section 1. purpose & Policy Direction

- Nonsan has already become a super-aged society. Considering this rapid aging of the society, it is urgent to develop its own model for an age-friendly city. Population aging is a global phenomenon. As Nonsan became a super-aged society earlier than other cities, it should be proactive in developing policies to cope with aging society in line with global trends related to aging society.
- Therefore, Nonsan should not follow a city concept modeled on passive senior citizens to whom unilateral welfare services have been provided. Instead, it should add the perspectives of "participation and cooperation" to "raise the quality of life of the elderly" as a way of preparing for a super-aged society. With the goal to "create a local community in which all generations recognize and support each other, and which connects to the future," in which every citizen continues to lead a vibrant life even after they are old and in which every citizen is given opportunities to show what they have, the city has set the following policy directions for the implementation plans based on the analysis on its current states and level of age-friendliness among other factors:

First, creating policies that consider the active life of all citizens including the elderly

- Due to advancement of medical technology, the elderly population will only to grow. This implies that the city should make preparations for senior citizens of today and of tomorrow,

thereby realizing a society where the elderly can live safely and a city where younger generations would want to live even when they become old. In this regard, it is necessary to build an age-friendly city assured of its sustainability, not the current elder-friendly city focusing only on the elderly population in its urban regeneration planning and overall public policy. This calls for social awareness and consensus on an age-friendly city throughout the entire life cycle.

Second, converging top-down and bottom-up approaches

- For an age-friendly city, it is extremely important to take into account the opinions of senior citizens, or the "users." The city government should establish the policies that can solve issues from the viewpoint of senior citizens, and serve as a bridging role between the society and senior citizens to avoid any social isolation. Therefore, it is necessary to use both approaches to keep a strong momentum: a bottom-up approach through which the opinions of the elderly are collected and the problems and solutions related to the environment of an age-friendly city are discussed, and a top-down approach through which political powers, such as the head of local governments or local councils, are utilized.

Third, creating an age-friendly city considering Nonsan' local characteristics

- While creating an age-friendly city should be based on the WHO Guide, it should consider Nonsan' local characteristics and practicability. In other words, the WHO Guide may be adjusted as necessary according to the city's aging population, social and cultural environment, health and medical services, urban

planning, transportation and welfare system.

□ Fourth, moving from "software" to "hardware" policies in a phased manner

- Nonsan has been successful in implementing elder-friendly programs and policies focusing on "software" features, such as human resources and services. Therefore, it should expand such policies that are performing well, and at the same time begin to implement policies with "hardware" features, such as infrastructure and facility, in a phased manner. As a huge budget may be required for projects related to building infrastructure, it is deemed more effective to create a social and psychological environment at the early stage of the project and to create a physical environment in the later stage.

□ Fifth, moving beyond mere senior policies and expanding to senior-friendly social changes

- An age-friendly city is not simply a policy to support the elderly; rather, it builds foundation for them to regain vitality and to lead a life as proud citizens in a civil society. In order to create a society where senior citizens can live together with other members of the society in harmony, people's perception of the elderly also needs to change. Negative perceptions towards senior citizens should be lifted away; rather, senior citizens should be encouraged to function as producers in the economic system and play a role of emotional mentors and social supporters for younger generations. In order to do so, it is essential to promote social movements aiming at raising awareness of social inequality and discrimination against the elderly and to build partnerships with various civil societies.

□ **Sixth, promoting a balanced growth**

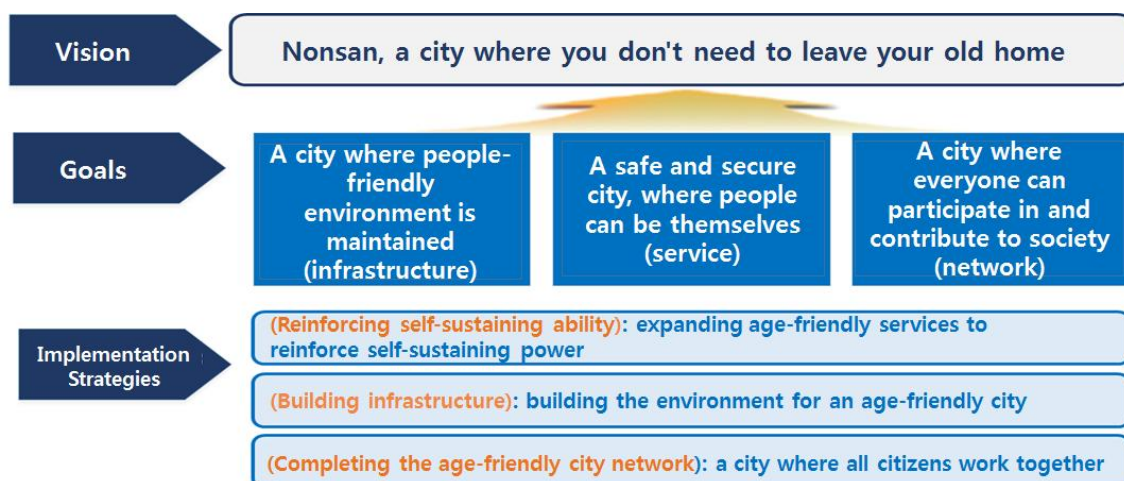
- The analysis on the city's conditions and the survey on the city's level of age-friendliness have confirmed that there are differences in the degree of elder-friendliness by area even within the city. The downtown is deemed to be equipped with a certain level of infrastructure while the other areas are better equipped with elder-friendly programs than actual physical infrastructure.
- An age-friendly city means that the entire city of Nonsan should have elder-friendly elements and that no discrimination or imbalance against senior citizens should occur anywhere in the city. Therefore, detailed analyses should be conducted at the level of each district on the level of age-friendliness and the gap in the supply of relevant infrastructure, based on which a balanced age-friendly city can be established.

Section 2. Vision and Implementation Strategy

- The fundamental ideas of the action plans are to respond to the city's situation of being a super-aged society with a view to "build a society where one needs each other" through the cooperation among citizens. They are about improving the quality of life of the elderly and vitalizing local communities by helping senior citizens to take advantage of their good knowledge and rich experience in a super-aged society, to play important roles in activities carried out in local communities, and to feel rewarded.

- The vision of Nonsan's action plans has been chosen to be “Nonsan, a city where you don't need to leave your old home.” The goal is to build a city where senior citizens lead a vibrant life with other citizens instead of leaving their old homes.
 - The purpose of the action plans is to overcome the issues arising from being a super-aged society, to improve the quality of life not only of the elderly but also of all other citizens, and to develop toward a bright future.
- ① Detailed Objective 1: Nonsan, a city where people-friendly environment is maintained (relevant areas: Areas 1, 2, 3)
 - The objective is about setting up a convenient and friendly environment. The city aims to create a village where the elderly population does not feel left out or isolated. Also, it aims to create a village where the elderly population has a healthy body and stamina by having more parks and riverbeds where senior citizens can enjoy sports and strolls.
 - ② Detailed Objective 2: Nonsan, a safe and secure city (relevant areas: Areas 5, 7, 8)
 - The objective is to create a village without discrimination against the elderly or the handicapped, where everyone feels safe and hence leads a secure life.
 - ③ Detailed Objective 3: Nonsan, a city where everyone can participate in society through jobs and social contribution (relevant areas: Areas 4, 6)
 - The objective is to create a village where everyone is granted an opportunity for social participation and contribution, such as

working and volunteering, and where everyone can play active parts.



Section 3. Selection of Implementation Indices

- Considering Nonsan's current situations, level of age-friendliness, and practicability, 52 indices in eight areas have been chosen for Nonsan's Age-Friendliness Level Implementation Indices.

- While the Implementation Indices were selected in reference to the WHO Guide, the project plans of the entire city government were also taken into consideration, which were then changed to fit the city's age-friendly situations. The final indices were chosen after consultation with the relevant civil servants of the city government.
- In addition, some indices were added after discussion with the city if they were considered essential to improve its age-friendliness level even if they had not been planned by the city government.

Section 4. Nonsan's Age-Friendly Indices

1. Area 1: Outdoor Spaces and Buildings

- Area 1 aims to create a city where senior citizens can live safely. Six indices have been chosen in total.
- The indices include the creation of eco-friendly infrastructure for the elderly and the maintenance of public facilities to keep them safe and clean.

9. Action Plans Budget (Draft)

- Looking at the budget of the action plans, the estimated budget for three years is 226.9 billion won: by year, about 75 billion won in 2018, about 74 billion won in 2019, and about 78 billion won in 2020.
- By Area, the budget is broken down as follows: approximately 2.5 billion won for Area 1, approximately 10 billion won for Area 2, approximately 5.1 billion won for Area 3, approximately 3.4 billion won for Area 4, approximately 0.7 billion won for Area 5, approximately 195.0 billion won for Area 6, approximately 1.3 billion won for Area 7, and approximately 9.5 billion won for Area 8. Civic Participation and Employment, or Area 6, is expected to require the highest budget.
- The reason the budget for Area 6 is way above other Areas is that Area 6 project include the establishment of centers that support employment and participation.

Section 6. Tasks to Perform

1. To stabilize the operation of divisions in charge of creating an age-friendly city

- Although Nonsan has Centenarians Happiness Division as a division in charge of an age-friendly city, it is essential that it collaborates consistently with other divisions, such as Welfare Division, Urban Restoration Division, Disabled Welfare Division, to promote an age-friendly city. Centenarians Happiness Division is located in an office outside of the city hall, so it is expected to face some difficulties in the process of consultation with other divisions. In this regard, Centenarians Happiness Division should have a good access in terms of discussion with other divisions, and the expertise of the persons responsible for the creation and operation of an age-friendly city should also be ensured.
- To do so, Centenarians Happiness Division needs to reinforce its manpower and secure the authority with which active cooperation of other divisions is assured.

2. To invigorate the activities of the Creation Committee to create an age-friendly city

- Nonsan has formed the Creation Committee to create an age-friendly city. The activities of the committee should be invigorated in a sense that it is responsible for deliberating on various policy issues related to the creation of an age-friendly city. Also, a cooperation system between the government and the private sector needs to be established to implement the project, so workshops, seminars and forums should take place frequently to collect a variety of opinions.

3. To establish a community-led, systematic cooperation system

- It is a must to expand the efforts of individuals and families, the role of the public sector as well as the role of different members of the local community, and to establish a systematic cooperation system between and among them in order to solve the difficulties that senior citizens face in their daily life. In this regard, it is necessary not only to establish a cooperation system between divisions, but also create an organic link through various networks between institutions and organizations in Nonsan (e.g. city hall, city council, university, research institute, social organizations).

4. To form age-friendly monitoring group

- It is essential to have an official channel for the participation of senior citizens in order to collect their opinions and reflect their demands into the policy in the process of policy making and implementation for an age-friendly city. The intent of such channel is not only to plan and enforce policies satisfactory to the elderly, but also to reflect their social experience and knowledge into the policy and to encourage them to take interest and show active participation in the creation of an age-friendly city.
- Furthermore, as senior citizens participate in the policy making and implementation as part of the monitoring group, their empowerment as the designer and evaluator of policies for the elderly population. This is expected to go well with the city's

vision of their senior citizens being "senior citizens who are respected, and who participate in local communities."

- The monitoring group finds policy ideas, represents the needs and opinions of the elderly population and performs the function of monitoring policy implementation.

5. To establish evaluation system for action plans

- Joining the age-friendly community network is not the end of creating an age-friendly city. The city needs to establish its action plans and perform constant management by implementing and evaluating the action plans, which will then result in certification. Therefore, post management after joining the network is even more important, which includes establishing and implementing action plans based on continued studies and making modifications after conducting evaluations.
- Seoul Metropolitan Government has conducted research consistently since 2010, and it has implemented its policies and action plans under a systematic management system.
- This study is to evaluate Nonsan's age-friendliness level and possibility of becoming an age-friendly city, and to come up with (draft) action plans. Therefore, a system is required to be planned afterwards in detail with regard to the evaluation of action plans, and creation and management of an age-friendly city.

Section 5. Roadmap to Create an Age-Friendly City

1. Preparation for Stage 2 - Implementation

- Nonsan completed its application to join an age-friendly community network in April 2018. It now has to enter the implementation stage in the cycle of four stages of the network. At the implementation stage, action plans are implemented and progress is checked. The main division responsible for creating an age-friendly city should oversee the entire work and each division in charge of projects should implement their age-friendly projects in good faith.
- In addition, the main in-charge division needs to conduct an evaluation on age-friendly effects, which is to understand the impact of various projects implemented according to action plans on the promotion of the rights, social participation, and leisure activities of senior citizens.

2. Project implementation in preparation for regular evaluation

- After joining the WHO Network of Age-Friendly Communities, a member of the network is subject to a regular evaluation. Therefore, following projects should be conducted as well to keep its status of an age-friendly city:
 - First, a regular research project on age-friendly cities to actively respond to various changes due to a super-aged society;
 - Second, an education project for all citizens to improve the mindset of citizens to be suitable for an age-friendly city and improve awareness;

- Third, an education and participatory project for senior citizens, who are the principal agent of an age-friendly city, to be respected by younger generations; and
- Fourth, a global cooperation project to promote global exchanges, such as mutual information exchanges and joint research, by becoming a member of international organizations and international conferences related to aging society.
