

1 Promotion direction

- Finding various jobs suitable for the elderly and middle-aged and disseminating cultural leisure programs reflecting the preferences of the elderly
- Establishing a tight social care network for the elderly in vulnerable groups, such as living alone, low income, and abuse damage, which is constantly increasing
- Reducing the burden of medical and nursing care for individuals and countries through preventing and managing rapidly increasing senior diseases such as dementia and strengthening public care
- Establishing and improving a safe and convenient living environment where the elderly can stay comfortably without leaving the place where they lived, and improving accessibility to welfare services

2 Promotion system

• Establishing and operating a bottom-up public-private partnership system throughout the whole promotion process of senior citizens' policies, such as policy discovery, review, promotion, inspection, evaluation, service delivery, and implementation.



- (Committee) Strengthening public-private partnerships and granting expertise and execution capabilities to whole senior citizens' policies
 - Within 15 persons, including experts, officials from related organizations, city councilors, and public officials
 - Action plan consultation, policy coordination, and evaluation related to the creation of an age-friendly city
- (City/Gu/Organization) Policy formulation, implementation, service delivery, on-site implementation
- (Monitoring group) Activating communication with policy subjects and establishing a bottom-up policy
 - Consisting of about 40 senior citizens who use senior welfare facilities, experts, and on-site practitioners
 - Finding and inspecting tasks by collecting policy opinions (facility visits, interviews, etc.)

 - Revitalization of sports for the elderly through the operation of various sports for the elderly
 - Senior welfare center and senior citizen center visits to provide guidance on sports for all and hold sports for all competitions
 - Operating clubs such as gateball, park golf, Korean archery, go, chess, badminton, etc.
 - * Expansion of the base through the operation of sports programs in autonomous districts (senior societies)

- o Operation of senior citizens' university to establish a new role as a senior citizen
 - Senior citizens aged 65 or older (80-100 people) / around 50 hours a year
 - Lectures and field trips such as liberal arts, culture, current affairs, life information, special lectures
- Operation of informatization education for the elderly in the information-vulnerable class
 - Operating programs that suit the level and preferences of the elderly (2,000 people per year)
 - * Computer basics, digital practical use, vocational education, mobile application courses, etc.
 - Conducting on-site education after demand survey for senior welfare centers in the jurisdiction
 - The Gwangju Jeonnam branch of the Korea Welfare Information and Communication Council, informatization education visit
- o Providing age-friendly public library services to strengthen access to knowledge and information for the elderly
 - Book section for the elderly such as health, leisure, psychology, publications (newspapers)
 - Expanding large-letter books (640 books per year), equipped with reading aids
 - Operation of reading culture programs for the elderly (2 programs per year)
- Promotion of customized cultural programs for the elderly
 - * Seo-gu, Gwangju
 - Creating a healthy play culture and enhancing harmony and vitality among senior citizen center members
 - Selecting of senior citizen centers in 18 dong to advance to the finals (traditional folk games competition at senior citizen centers)
 - * Four events: Yutnori, ring throwing, Tuho, Korean archery

- o 100 years old friends, 100 years old club who take care of each other
 - * Dong-gu, Gwangju
 - Support for the operation of 20 clubs within 10 people (200 people)
 - (Type of activity) Calligraphy, healthy gymnastics, knitting, art, yoga, ground golf, etc.
 - * Mutual safety confirmation by group (daily), sharing leisure life, handling crisis, etc.

3. Strengthening smart care welfare

3-1 Systematic provision of welfare services for the elderly

- ☐ Providing close care services for the elderly in vulnerable groups such as living alone, low income, and mobility difficulties, and establishing a care infrastructure using smart devices such as ICT
 - Providing customized care services for the elderly
 - Expansion of support targets (13,928 people \rightarrow 15,680 people), increasing of provision personnel (925 people \rightarrow 1,034 people)
 - Integrated support for elderly care services and provision of care services by region (19 organizations in 5 districts)
 - Providing customized services for the elderly in need of care
 - * (Personalized services) Safety support, social participation, and daily life support
 - * (Specialized service) Support for group programs for suicide prevention for the elderly in seclusion and depression
 - Free meal support for the elderly who are concerned about skipping meals
 - Price of meal support (KRW 4,000 per meal) / 4,445 people per year (basic living recipients, the secondary poor class, etc.)
 - Operating senior restaurants (29 locations) and delivering lunch box for the elderly with mobility difficulties (10 locations)
 - * Improving the quality of meals through hygiene inspection and supervision of project cost execution details.
 - O Basic pension payment for providing a stable income base for the elderly
 - Pension payment to senior citizens aged 65 or older whose income recognition amount is below the selection criteria amount
 - * "Upgraded base amount in 2023 (KRW 1.8 million → KRW 2.02 million for single households, KRW 2.88 million → KRW 32.32 million for married households)
 - Strengthening the operation and publicity activities of the "history management system for supply and demand request" to discover recipients

- Support for emergency safety and security services for the elderly living alone and the disabled
 - Installing and operating in-house equipment for ICT-based next-generation emergency safety and security service in the home
 - Installation of fire/gas detectors, activity sensors, and quick response in case of an emergency
- Establishment of smart care services for the elderly and mobile healthcare
 - Establishment of smart care services using ICT devices (performance Organization: Seo-gu, Gwangju)
 - * Providing smart care services such as emergency safety, emotional support, medical and health management.
 - Mobile healthcare for customized health care using health examination results
 - * Provide health living practice services: health information transmission, monitoring, counseling, etc.

3-@ Promotion of senior citizens' human rights and spread of respect culture for the elderly

- ☐ Preventing elder abuse, which is continuously increasing due to aging and nuclear family, and spreading the culture of senior human rights and elderly filial piety.
 - Prevention of elder abuse and operation of a shelter exclusively for the abused elderly
 - Systematic and professional response to elder abuse, such as case reception, counseling, and on-site investigation
 - * Operation of case judgment committee consisting of experts from all walks of life (8 persons, once a quarter)
 - Temporary protection of the abused elderly, provision of psychological counseling programs, medical support, etc.

- Human rights education for workers in senior welfare facilities to improve the sensitivity of human rights for the elderly and the understanding of human rights for the elderly.
 - Senior counseling techniques, case study, tips for dealing with human rights violations, education on kind service, etc.
 - 40 times a year / target: employees of welfare facilities and long-term care facilities
- Holding the respect and filial piety event to improve social awareness of the elderly
 - Twice a year (Parents' Day, Senior Citizens' Day) / ceremony, additional events*, celebratory performances, etc.
 - * Organization of additional events such as physical education and art centered on senior citizens' participation
 - Succession and development of pan-citizen filial piety culture through discovery and commendation of people spreading filial piety

4. Support for health and care services

4-1 Health promotion for the elderly

- ☐ Health care for the elderly on a regular basis to prevent diseases, treat early, and reduce social medical expenses
 - Operation of a health senior citizen center for the elderly who use senior citizen centers in vulnerable areas (circular medical treatment)
 - Supporting doctors in charge of senior citizen centers and providing medical services (500 locations per year)
 - * Health counseling (doctors' association), oriental medicine treatment (oriental medicine doctors' association), oral examination (dentists' association)
 - * Health promotion program operation and health check (blood pressure, blood sugar, osteoporosis test, etc.)
 - Providing visiting health care services by life cycle for the medical-vulnerable groups (elderly living alone, elderly with mobility difficulties) (20,000 people per year)
 - Management of chronic diseases such as hypertension and diabetes and prevention of complications
 - Prevention of diseases such as anitsmoking, antialcoholism, and physical activity by practicing healthy life
 - Familiarization with tips for preparing for heat waves and cold waves, prevention of falls, management of depression and dementia, etc.
 - Medical examination for the elderly for early detection and treatment of diseases
 - Medical benefit recipients aged 65 or older, the secondary poor class (about 800 people per year)
 - * (1st) Basic medical treatment and blood tests, etc. /(2nd) Observed and sick persons after the 1st examination

- o Internet of Things-based health care services for the elderly
 - Providing non-face-to-face health care services using smart technology
 - Senior citizens aged 65 or older who need to improve chronic diseases and health behavior (3,000 people per year)
 - * Providing mobile application and IoT-based health measurement devices (period: 6 months)
- Operation of the age-friendly industry support center
 - * Gwangju Institute of Science and Technology
 - Development and commercialization of dementia and fall prevention technology, promotion of the age-friendly medical device industry, etc.
 - Technical guidance, corporate support such as marketing, product experience, life experience, etc.

4-2 Expansion of dementia prevention infrastructure

- ☐ Environmental improvement of elderly care facilities and expansion of infrastructure for dementia prevention and management
 - O Strengthening of functions of senior nursing facilities
 - Improvement of the facility environment for the safety and convenience of the elderly using senior nursing facilities
 - Facilities expansion, renovation, equipment reinforcement, fire safety window installation support, etc.
 - Project target: senior nursing facilities, day and night care facilities, nursing facilities, etc.
 - Operation of dementia relief center for effective and systematic dementia management and prevention services
 - Providing services such as registration of dementia patients, counseling and early examination, case management, etc.
 - Short-term dementia shelter (daytime protection) and operation of dementia cafe (family manager), etc.
 - * Operating 1 location (total 5) for each autonomous district

- Operation of dementia patient support program to return to daily lives of dementia patients
 - Supporting dementia patients and their families to return to their daily lives, creating a dementia-friendly environment, etc.
 - Operation of dementia support programs in public nursing hospitals
 - * Operating Institution (2 locations): 1st Gwangju Municipal Nursing Hospital, 2nd Gwangju Municipal Nursing Hospital
- Establishment of dementia demonstration center to develop AI-based customized dementia technology
 - Development of healthcare industry linking dementia biometric data with artificial intelligence convergence industry
