Tongyeong-city is a famous marine tourism city located on the southernmost coast of South Korea, and it is a medium-sized city with a population of about 130,000. As of the end of September 2020, the proportion of the elderly aged 65 or older in our city reached 19.3%, and the proportion of the elderly population is rapidly increasing by more than 1% each year, therefore we expect to enter a super-age society of more than 20% by 2022.

Our city has set the vision of an Age-Friendly City and Communities as "100 years old city, land of the sea-Tongyeong". With the three major priorities, such as creating a convenient and safe infrastructures, creating a happy community, and a healthy old life, we would like to take a step toward the better future with WHO's Age-Friendly City and Communities Network.

In line with the WHO's guidelines, our city will develope and implement urban policies that are appropriate for the aging of citizens, will also create a city that is good for all citizens to live their whole lives, and will also pursue our best effort in reorganizing and redesigning the physical and social environment.

We are very pleased to apply for the designation of the WHO's Age-Friendly City Communities Network.
