1. Summary

- The vision of the 1st phase Geumcheon-gu Age Friendly City is 'Geumcheon, a city with an aged life that we hope for'
 - To build the 1st phase action plan, Geumcheon-gu collected opinions of the city residents and analyzed 8 major area in WHO's guidelines.
 - The 1st phase action plan has 4 major goals of 'Safe Geumcheon where we can move freely,' 'Healthy Geumcheon we care for each other,' 'Growing Geumcheon through participation and contribution,' and 'Geumcheon for all generations'. A total of 54 projects were planned for 2024.

- Vision: Geumcheon, a city with an aged life that we hope for

- Period: 2022~2024

- Projects: 4 major goals/8 Areas/54 Projects

- Overall performance is satisfactory. 51 projects (88%) out of 56 projects in 2022 achieved more than 90% of projects goals
- Projects that failed to achieve their goals suffered from external elements, making it impossible to satisfy its objects. The situations surround those projects are expected to improve gradually

(Table 6) Summary of the committee's opinions

Evaluation results

- Overall, the projects are doing fine. Channels of residents' opinion collection need to be diversified
- Efforts of the district office are notable. There are, however, some project that were behined the schedules
- Gasan-dong need parks for senior residents
- A control center is needed for community support and health services projects
- Scores for outdoor spaces and buildings projects were low, a policy response is necessary
- There are senior targeted projects that appear as general living infrastructure improvement projects
- For dementia prevention programs, continuous physical exercise as puzzles can be importatn as well
- The number of seniors that benefit from readinc club project and bookstore project may be too small. Mental and physical activities support programs should be connected to those projects
- More projects that take changes in population structure change should be developed

- The number of survey patcipants should be increased
