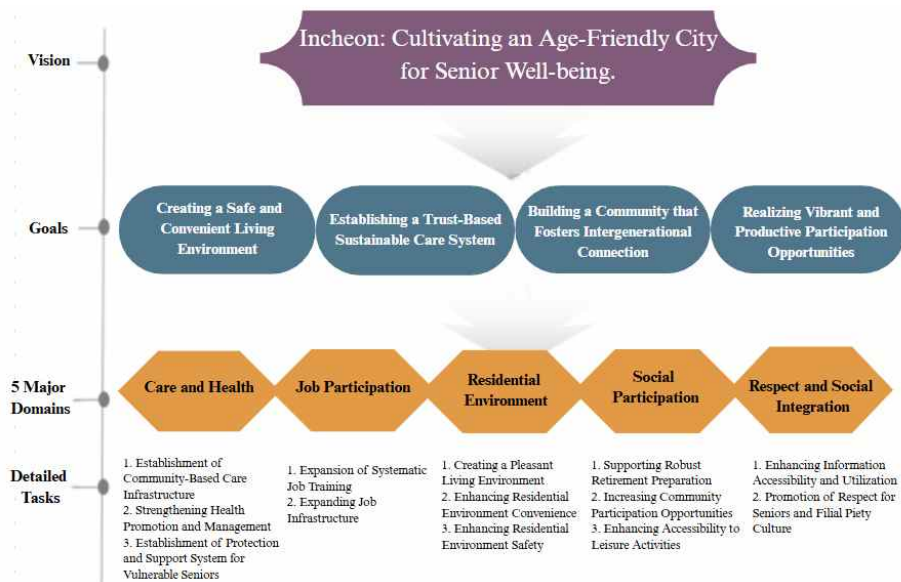

Chapter 1. Incheon Metropolitan City's Age-Friendly City

Phase 2 Vision System

- The vision and goals established during the formulation of the Phase 1 Age-Friendly City Action Plan will be sustained, and the vision and goals for Incheon Metropolitan City's Age-Friendly City Phase 2, encompassing new meanings and directions to be pursued, are presented in [Figure 1-1].
- The vision for Incheon Metropolitan City's Age-Friendly City Phase 2 is proposed as 'Incheon: An Age-Friendly City Where Seniors Are Happy.'
- This vision embodies the commitment to realize cultural welfare policies that enable joyful aging through continuous and proactive support policies, addressing the psycho-social anxieties associated with population aging, extended old age, and the apprehensions and concerns about growing older.
- To realize the vision of "Incheon: An Age-Friendly City Where Seniors Are Happy," we have set four key goals:
 - Establishing a Trustworthy and Sustainable Care System
 - Realizing Opportunities for Vibrant and Productive Participation
 - Creating a Safe and Convenient Living Environment
 - Building a Community that Fosters Intergenerational Connection
- Based on the Phase 2 Age-Friendly City vision and its four major objectives, 5 domains and 13 detailed tasks have been derived.

- Regarding the domain structure, the 8 WHO domains were reorganized into 5 domains through expert opinion review and research team discussions during the establishment of the 1st phase implementation plan. This framework will be maintained and applied identically in the 2nd phase.

Project Necessity and Objectives

- To ensure stable later life and prevent functional and health deterioration by providing appropriate care services to vulnerable older persons facing difficulties in daily life.

Project Overview

- Target Beneficiaries: Older persons in need of care due to physical, economic, or psychological difficulties, including those living alone, grandparent-headed households, and elderly couples.
- Project Contents:
 - Safety Support: Safety checks via visits and phone calls, information provision, companionship.
 - Social Participation: Participation in in-person programs (lifelong education, cultural programs).
 - Life Education: Life education in physical and mental health, tips for coping with extreme heat and cold, etc.
 - Daily Life Support: Accompanied outings, household support (limited to intensive care recipients).
 - Linkage Services: Connection with private resources within the local community.
 - Specialized Services: Case management and group activities for isolated and depressed older persons.

Project Overview

- Target Beneficiaries: Older persons living alone who require safety checks, among those receiving customized care services for older persons.
- Project Contents: Distribution of IoT safety phones to older persons living alone and their care workers, and support for communication fees.

Project Necessity and Objectives

- To establish an emergency reporting system capable of swift response in case of fires, gas leaks, or similar accidents, by installing fire and gas detectors in the homes of vulnerable older persons and persons with disabilities.

Project Overview

- Target Beneficiaries: Vulnerable older persons (including those living alone, grandparent-headed households, two-person older adult households, etc.) and persons with disabilities.

- Project Contents: Installation of emergency equipment in homes of vulnerable older persons and persons with disabilities, monitoring of information transmitted by equipment, regular safety checks, and equipment inspections.

- Project Scale: 19 Home-Based Senior Support Service Centers, 57 personnel.
- Target Audience: Vulnerable and at-risk seniors who face difficulties maintaining their daily lives due to economic, physical, or mental reasons.
- Project Contents: Daily life support, improvement of residential environment, leisure activity support, counseling, community resource linkage, education, emergency support, case management, etc.

- Project Contents: Establishment of a metropolitan-level cooperation and support system to substantively integrate, link, and provide various care services centered on the needs of beneficiaries, in accordance with the enforcement of the Integrated Care Support Act.

Project Necessity and Objectives

- Support for long-term care benefit co-payments for basic livelihood security recipients and other medical aid beneficiaries, for whom the national and local governments are responsible, following the enforcement of the Long-Term Care Insurance Act in 2008.
- Support for costs of facility benefits and home-based benefits (home care, home nursing, home bathing, day/night care, short-term care, welfare aids, etc.) for older persons who are basic livelihood security and other medical aid recipients and have difficulty in daily life due to physical or mental health reasons.

Project Overview

- Target Beneficiaries: (2025) 15,696 persons → (2029) 22,000 persons
 - Long-term care graded individuals (grades 1-5), and cognitive support graded individuals, among basic livelihood security recipients and other medical aid beneficiaries.
- Project Contents:
 - Support for management and operation fees of the National Health Insurance Service and other co-payments.
 - Cost burden for facility and home-based care benefits:
 - Basic livelihood security recipients: 100% of the graded service fee from the local government.
 - Other medical aid beneficiaries: 20% of the graded service fee from the local government.
