I am writing on behalf of Flintshire County Council to apply for membership of the World Health Organisation's Global Network of Age Friendly Cities and Communities.

The 2021 Census recording that more than one in five people living in Flintshire (21.4%) are aged 65 and over. This is an increase of 23.7% compared to the previous Census in 2011.
