  Greetings. This is Kang Sung-tae, the Mayor of Suyeong-gu in Busan Metropolitan City.
- O Suyeong-gu envisions "Beautiful City, Happy Suyeong," where all residents can enjoy happiness through culture and become the main actors, while living in a city that embodies both history and advanced social culture, tourism, and maritime culture. We are making great efforts to make Suyeong where all residents of all ages are happy.
- O As of the end of December 2022, the total population of Suyeong-gu was 174,806, with a 65-year and older population of 40,697, which accounts for 23.2%, making us a super-aged society.
