## Application to the World Health Organisation, to join the Age Friendly Cities Communities Global Network

I am pleased, as Leader of South Lanarkshire Council, to submit South Lanarkshire's application to join the Age-friendly Cities and Communities Global Network. South Lanarkshire Council's application has been endorsed by the South Lanarkshire Community Planning Partnership Board which brings together all the key statutory, business, voluntary and community sector leaders and by our representative voice of older people in South Lanarkshire, Seniors Together.

The Board recognises that developing age-friendly policies supports its existing work to develop an Inclusive Economy, improved Health and Wellbeing, and Fairness and Equality.
