

Action Plan for Agefriendly Community in Upplands-Bro 1 July 2024 – 1 July 2027

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1 Summary

he work to make Upplands-Bro Municipality more Age-friendly is rooted in its membership with the World Health Organization (WHO), where each member is required to develop an action plan. By making the municipality more Age-friendly, not only older individuals but also other residents benefit from the measures taken.

As part of the municipality's overall strategy to improve the quality of life for all residents of Upplands-Bro and contribute to the global sustainability goals outlined in Agenda 2030, the municipality has decided to focus on creating a more age-adapted community.

The municipality applied for membership in the WHO's Network for Agefriendly Cities and Communities, which was approved on July 18, 2023. Researchers from various parts of the world have identified strategies to improve the municipality's adaptation to older citizens. This membership opens up extensive dialogue between the municipality and international researchers, as well as national members, on the subject.

The goal is to develop a plan to make the municipality more Age-friendly in a sustainable way and to promote the creation of an inclusive and safe environment that considers all age groups and functional levels. This includes collaboration with pensioners' associations and other relevant groups to ensure that the plan is well-balanced and takes into account various perspectives and needs.

The action plan includes selected activities for four focus areas: social inclusion, the outdoor and built environment, civic participation and employment, communication, and information. Concrete activities have been developed within each focus area to promote the social inclusion of older adults, improve the physical environment both outdoors and within buildings,



increase civic participation and promote employment, as well as enhance communication and access to information for older residents.

The action plan is set for the period from July 1, 2024, to July 1, 2027, and includes regular reporting and follow-up on the implemented measures. It is the responsibility of the relevant office to report annually during each quarterly report to the project manager using tools for budget and performance monitoring. These reports are then compiled by the project manager to enable further follow-up by the Elderly and Care Committee in Upplands-Bro.



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
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2 Structure of the Action Plan

pplands-Bro Municipality has chosen to use the WHO framework and integrate it with Agenda 2030 to create a tailored action plan for the municipality. The municipality aims to more clearly promote the perspective of the elderly and is replacing the previous elderly plan with the current action plan. The focus is on promoting meaningful and quality aging, supported by four sustainability goals: 3 *Good Health and Well-being*, 5 *Gender Equality*, 10 *Reduced Inequality*, and 11 *Sustainable Cities and Communities*¹.

The action plan is divided into two parts. The first part explains the needs in Upplands-Bro for becoming an Age-friendly municipality, while the second part outlines how the municipality will work to achieve this goal.



The second part specifies the direction Upplands-Bro Municipality has chosen to take. It presents various measures and their rationale, including explanations of how they will be implemented and how they contribute to making the municipality more Age-friendly. A unified approach is outlined for future work, including clear follow-up routines and evaluation within the project. This is done to ensure that the long-term perspective is maintained and to confirm that Upplands-Bro is working proactively.

3 Introduction

n 2007, the World Health Organization published a global initiative called "Age-friendly Cities and Communities," which became a comprehensive handbook for developing Age-friendly communities around the world. This handbook consists of eight guidelines. Upplands-Bro Municipality has made an active decision to engage in becoming an Age-friendly municipality and is purposefully striving towards this goal. Becoming an Age-friendly municipality is a process that requires continuous work overtime. It involves gradually implementing measures and changes to improve conditions for older residents and, indirectly, all generations.²

Many countries with rising living standards are expected to see an increasing proportion of older people, partly due to the more common occurrence of improved living conditions. Therefore, it is crucial for countries and cities to take actions that reflect demographic developments and meet the needs of the aging population.³

According to WHO, demographic changes worldwide involve an increase in the older population relative to the younger population. These changes present challenges globally and require each municipality and nation to act strategically to address them in a beneficial and sustainable way.⁴ There are numerous examples of cities and communities around the world that are proactively working to create more Age-friendly municipalities; this is done to

strategically meet the current and future needs of older residents. WHO established the global network to promote cities' efforts toward age-friendliness due to global aging, which affects the development of all countries.

Implementation

This action plan is based on a thorough baseline assessment that was conducted to accurately identify the existing strengths within Upplands-Bro, the specific needs that must be addressed, and the areas that require development and improvement to make Upplands-Bro an even more Age-friendly place.

In all parts of the baseline assessment, older residents were actively involved. A total of 136 older individuals contributed by sharing their needs and providing feedback in various ways.

3.1 Purpose of the Plan

The purpose of the action plan is to gather, clarify, and promote the elderly perspective across all operational areas within the municipality's various



departments and activities. By concretizing measures and setting clear timelines, the action plan also aims to improve the living environment for older residents.

3.2 Goal of the Plan

The goal is to develop a plan to make the municipality more Age-friendly in a sustainable way and to promote the creation of an inclusive and safe environment that considers all age groups and functional levels.

3.3 Project Description

The action plan is rooted in the municipality's membership with WHO, where each member is required to develop an action plan. The municipal council decided on June 9, 2021, that Upplands-Bro should become an Age-friendly municipality. This decision tasked the Social Office with submitting an application to WHO for the Age-friendly Cities and Communities initiative. This mission was based on the results of the baseline assessment conducted on November 10, 2022. The municipal executive board decided that the plan should be developed according to WHO's concept for Age-friendly cities and communities and in collaboration with municipal departments and companies.

3.4 Validity Period of the Action Plan

The action plan applies to the period from July 1, 2024, to July 1, 2027.

4 Target Group

The primary target group consists of the offices and companies within Upplands-Bro Municipality that directly or indirectly influence the lives of the municipality's older residents. The secondary target group is the older residents of Upplands-Bro, who will directly benefit from the measures implemented by



the municipality according to the action plan. While many of these measures are primarily designed to benefit older residents, they also contribute to improving the community for everyone.

5 Background

he municipal council decided at its meeting on June 9, 2021, that Upplands-Bro Municipality should apply for membership in WHO's Global Network for Age-friendly Cities and Communities (AFCC). The issue was raised a year earlier by the Alliance through a council member initiative. The Social Office was tasked with hiring a project manager who has overseen the application process and the development of the municipality-wide action plan with associated activities. The project manager collaborated with the municipality's elderly residents to conduct the baseline assessment, which began on October 5, 2022, and concluded on November 30, 2022.

After the baseline assessment was compiled, the membership application was submitted to WHO on March 13, 2023. After review, the membership was approved on July 26, 2023. The work on the action plan began with all departments in Upplands-Bro on September 4, 2023, and was handed over to the Elderly and Care Committee on March 28, 2024, upon completion.

All members of WHO's network are committed to following a specific approach, clearly outlined in WHO's document titled "Creating Age-friendly Environments in Europe: A Tool for Local Policy-Makers and Planners." The process used to promote age-friendliness can be divided into four distinct phases.



- Engagement and Understanding: The process to promote age-friendliness within the municipality begins by engaging older residents and gaining a deeper understanding of their needs, experiences, and perspectives. This is achieved through a comprehensive baseline assessment.
- Development of the Action Plan: Based on the information gathered during the baseline assessment, a close collaboration across different sectors with broad representation leads to the development of an action plan. This plan includes concrete measures aimed at improving age-friendliness within the municipality.
- Implementation: The action plan moves from planning to action, with the measures being implemented to create real change and improvements in the municipality's Age-friendly environment.
- Follow-up and Evaluation: After two years, the progress of the action plan is reviewed, and a comprehensive evaluation is conducted to assess its effectiveness. This evaluation also identifies any adjustments or additional measures needed to continuously improve the municipality's agefriendliness.



6 WHO's Eight Guidelines for an Age-friendly Community

The eight guidelines identified and established by WHO in 2010 are as follows:

Upplands-Bro Municipality has decided to establish a focus area that includes the following four sub-areas:




Figure 2: The Municipality's Focus Areas for Developing an Age-friendly Community

At the same time, the remaining Age-friendly Cities and Communities (AFCC) areas—Community Support and Health Services, Public Transportation and Mobility, and Housing—will not be excluded. These areas are still considered



important for promoting a healthy and active aging process in the municipality. However, the primary responsibility for these areas generally falls outside the municipality's jurisdiction and mandate. The area of Respect and Social Inclusion will not be excluded either; instead, it will be integrated into the focus area of Social Participation.

By including all boards and companies within Upplands-Bro Municipality in the action plan, a unified and coordinated direction is created for the municipality's development during the period from July 1, 2024, to July 1, 2027.

7 Agenda 2030

Agenda 2030 is an action plan with 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) aimed at transitioning to a sustainable society for people, the planet, and prosperity. What makes Agenda 2030 unique is its universal nature, meaning that all countries and cities share a common responsibility for its implementation.⁵

By making the municipality Age-friendly and implementing the measures in the action plan, Upplands-Bro will contribute to achieving several key global goals, including Goal 3 (Good Health and Well-being) and Goal 5 (Gender Equality). By creating accessible and safe public spaces and facilities for older residents, such as parks and walking paths, the municipality promotes an active lifestyle for older citizens, which can improve their overall health and well-being, aligning with Goal 3.⁶ Additionally, by ensuring that both older women and men have equal access to these public resources and are included in matters related to urban planning and community development, the

municipality supports the principles of equality, thereby reducing inequalities as per Goals 5 and 10. Indirectly, this also promotes sustainable urban planning for all residents, in line with Goal 11.

7.1 Good Health and Well-being



Good Health and Well-being is one of the goals that Upplands-Bro Municipality will address to improve the quality of life for its older residents and enable active aging. To reduce health risks and diseases among the elderly, Agenda 2030 aims to promote preventive measures, helping older people remain active, independent, and

contributing members of society. Older residents have rights that need to be respected and protected, as Agenda 2030 emphasizes. This also means promoting and encouraging social integration to combat ageism. By fostering social integration and showing respect, Upplands-Bro Municipality contributes to an improved quality of life and a more active old age, leading to increased inclusion of older people in society.⁷

7.2 Gender Equality



Agenda 2030 also aims to promote gender equality and inclusion for women, which directly relates to older women who have historically faced inequality and discrimination throughout their lives. Agenda 2030 seeks to ensure equal access to employment, education, health, and

political participation for women of all ages, including older women and their rights.⁸

7.3 Reduced Inequality



Older residents can be particularly vulnerable to economic and social inequality. Those living on low incomes or without access to social safety nets may be especially affected. Agenda 2030 aims to promote social safety nets and accessible healthcare for older residents, which in turn can help reduce inequalities. By creating a community in Upplands-Bro where older

residents have opportunities to participate actively and where their rights are respected and protected, the municipality can combat social inequality.⁹

7.4 Sustainable Cities and Communities



By promoting sustainable urban development and communities, Agenda 2030 aims to facilitate access to green spaces, improve public transportation, and reduce environmental degradation that leads to global climate change. For older residents in Upplands-Bro, this means access to accessible and sustainable transportation systems, such as public transport

and walking and cycling paths. Green spaces can also have positive effects on health and well-being, benefiting older individuals. It is also about adapting



buildings and public spaces to better meet the needs of older and disabled persons to create more accessible places. ¹⁰

8 Method

Upplands-Bro follows four guiding principles to become a more Age-friendly municipality and acts upon them to meet the community's needs. After compiling and analyzing insights from older residents, the municipality identifies both challenges and opportunities to develop measures that make Upplands-Bro a better place to age.

By engaging in these dialogues, the municipality will identify the challenges and opportunities that its older residents face. This will provide the municipality with a deeper understanding of the most pressing issues and the areas where improvements can be made.





Finally, the vision is not only to listen and identify problems and opportunities but also to act and develop concrete solutions. The aim is to make Upplands-Bro a more Age-friendly and inclusive municipality.

9 Measures and Activities for the Four Focus Areas

The actions in the action plan are formulated in a comprehensive manner to clarify the municipality's goals while allowing flexibility and innovation in implementation.

9.1 Social participation

Social participation in an Age-friendly municipality, according to Upplands-Bro's definition, means that older citizens are given the opportunity to be actively engaged in society and to participate in various social, cultural, and community activities. It is about creating an environment where older people feel included, respected, and involved in community life.

Why: The "Bro och Kungsdagen" event is held outdoors in the central districts of the municipality to foster social integration among residents. Involving older citizens in planning and evaluating this event is crucial to enhance their well-being, include their perspectives, and create a more Age-friendly community.

How: The municipality will involve older residents early in the planning process, allowing them to share their views, which are valuable for shaping their participation in the event. Post-event evaluations with older residents will assess the event's success and identify areas for improvement.

Age-friendly: These events promote an Age-friendly municipality by encouraging social integration between younger and older generations. By including older residents in the planning and evaluation, the municipality meets the needs identified during the baseline survey.

1.2	Participation in the SAMSAS Project to Reach Out to Socially Isolated Elderly	ÄON	ÄON (preventive unit)	2023– 2025

Many older people experiencing involuntary loneliness feel isolated and forgotten. Through the SAMSAS project, the municipality can create opportunities for these individuals to regain a sense of belonging and community. Promoting interaction among older residents benefits their mental and emotional well-being and increases their engagement in society.

How: The municipality will identify the needs of isolated elderly residents, collaborate with senior associations, offer tailored activities and resources, communicate effectively, recruit and train volunteers, continuously evaluate and adapt the project, secure necessary resources, and document and report results.

Age-friendly: This project contributes to an Age-friendly municipality by increasing social connections, promoting health and activity among older people, and preserving and transmitting knowledge.

The "Vinterrummet" initiative is important as it creates a shared space for residents, especially older ones, to meet and interact. It fosters social cohesion and improves the quality of life for older residents through various activities and events. The initiative also facilitates intergenerational exchange and strengthens the community's identity.

How To make a winter gathering place accessible for older residents, the municipality must ensure that the roads are free from snow and ice, provide good lighting and accessibility, plan winter-adapted activities and events, and communicate clearly about the opportunities available to older residents.

Age-friendly: A winter-adapted gathering place supports an Age-friendly community by promoting social interaction and participation among both older and younger residents. By effectively communicating available activities and opportunities, the gathering place helps keep older residents informed and engaged in local community life.

Why: Culture plays a vital role in society, contributing to a meaningful existence and well-being for older citizens. It involves providing cultural and artistic opportunities tailored to the interests and needs of older individuals, such as concerts, theater performances, art exhibitions, music activities, book clubs, and dance. These cultural events and programs foster social interaction, creativity, and a sense of community, making them an essential part of creating an inclusive and enriching environment for older residents.

How: Upplands-Bro will collaborate with local artists and organizations to create cultural activities for older residents. They will organize concerts, art exhibitions, and other events that interest older people, ensuring accessible venues and informing the elderly about available opportunities.

Age-friendly: Cultural activities enhance the quality of life for older residents, promote social cohesion, encourage creativity, preserve cultural heritage, improve health, and create an inclusive environment where people of all ages can participate in the community. This is a key component of making the municipality more Age-friendly.

Alzheimer's Awareness Day is important for raising awareness about dementia and its impact on society. Such efforts can reduce stigma and make the community more inclusive and supportive for people with dementia and their families.

How: By planning events and collaborating with local organizations, Upplands-Bro will increase awareness and reduce stigma related to dementia.

Age-friendly: Raising awareness about dementia and providing support resources create a more inclusive and supportive environment for older people with dementia and their caregivers. It also fosters

Why: The International Day of Older Persons is important as it raises awareness about the rights of older adults, promotes their welfare and health, fosters understanding between generations, and highlights the contributions of the elderly to society. The day serves as a reminder of the importance of treating older people with dignity and respect, while also addressing ageism, which is one of the biggest challenges recognized by the WHO.

How: The International Day of Older Persons is celebrated on October 1st through public events, education and awareness campaigns, ceremonies honoring older adults, volunteer work, media coverage, and social media.

Age-friendly: The celebration of the International Day of Older Persons contributes to an Age-friendly community by raising awareness of the rights and needs of older adults, promoting civic engagement among the elderly, fostering respect and inclusion, supporting the well-being of older people, and building bridges between generations. It creates an environment where people of all ages can thrive and feel included.

Why: Meeting place activities for older adults are essential for promoting their well-being through social interaction and activities that support physical and cognitive health. These gatherings help combat loneliness and depression while serving as a resource for support and information.

How: In Upplands-Bro, there are existing meeting place activities that are developed in consultation with the municipality's older residents.

A meeting place for older adults contributes to an age-friendly: friendly community by fostering social connections and reducing the risk of isolation. By offering tailored physical and intellectual activities, both physical and mental health are supported. The meeting place also serves as an information source and support center for the elderly, creating a safer and more informed older population within the community.

Why: Dementia Friends and Mini Dementia Friends play a crucial role in offering social support and reducing the stigma surrounding dementia. These initiatives improve the quality of life for people with dementia by promoting interaction and community involvement. They also provide support to relatives and raise awareness about the challenges faced by people with dementia and their families in society.

How: By offering 90-minute training sessions, the municipality aims to increase awareness about dementia among both older and younger generations, including residents, officials, and potentially local politicians.

Age-friendly: Demensvänner och minidemensvänner bidrar till en äldrevänlig kommun genom att öka förståelsen för demenssjukdomar och minska isolering. Genom socialt stöd och utbildning skapar de en inkluderande och empatisk samhällsmiljö för äldre invånare.

Why: "Star-Rated" is an important training model for promoting person centered care in elderly care. It provides staff with the necessary tools and knowledge to tailor care according to the individual's needs and preferences.

How: When at least 80% of the staff have completed the four training steps, and the workplace actively applies the model's principles, it is awarded the "Star-Rated" designation. The star rating is reviewed annually to ensure continued compliance with the model's standards and principles.

Age-friendly: By implementing the "Star-Rated" training model in elderly care, an Age-friendly community is promoted through person-centered care and high-quality services. It raises awareness about issues related to the elderly and fosters a culture that values the well-being and dignity of older adults.

Why: Many older individuals require accessible housing and/or increased opportunities for social interaction to thrive and lead an independent and active life. This is especially important for those who may no longer be able to live at home due to various circumstances, such as health problems or social isolation.

How: To meet this need, it is important to create more spaces in senior housing where older people can live in a safe and secure environment while having access to social activities. This could involve expanding existing facilities and improving current housing to enhance accessibility and capacity.

Age-friendly:

By creating more spaces in senior housing that offer proximity to services and opportunities for social interaction, the municipality can foster a more Age-friendly environment. These homes should be designed with the needs of older adults in mind, such as accessibility for individuals with limited mobility and opportunities for communal activities and socializing. This contributes to improving the quality of life and well-being of older residents.



9.2 The Outdoor Environment and Buildings

One of the focus areas in the action plan is the outdoor and building environment. According to Upplands-Bro's definition, this involves creating a physical and architectural environment that is Age-friendly. This means ensuring accessibility, safety, and well-being for older citizens, both outdoors and indoors. It includes adapting sidewalks, buildings, and public spaces to meet the specific needs of the elderly, such as wheelchair access, accessibility adaptations, and proper lighting. An Age-friendly environment is fundamental to promoting the well-being and independence of older people in society.

Upplands-Bro municipality will include the following measures and initiatives in the outdoor and building environment for older residents:

Why: To reduce crime and create a safer neighborhood, a redevelopment of Bro Center will be undertaken. This redevelopment aims to improve both the physical and social aspects of the area, including infrastructure, lighting, green spaces, and community engagement. This project is part of an overall strategy to promote healthy and safe urban development, with a focus on the well-being and security of the residents.

How: Through broad and active collaboration with both internal and external stakeholders in the municipality, and continuous dialogue with the residents, including the elderly, Bro Center will be transformed.

Age-friendly: Through broad collaboration with internal and external stakeholders in the municipality and dialogue with residents, including the elderly, the redevelopment of Bro Center contributes to an Age-friendly community. It promotes the participation of older adults, increases accessibility, safety, inclusion, and improves quality of life.

How: By first consulting with older residents to understand their needs and preferences regarding the placement and design of benches, it's important to consider accessibility and place the benches in locations that are easy for older people to reach. Safety is a priority, so the benches should be stable and ergonomically designed to minimize any risks for elderly individuals who may have difficulty sitting or standing (e.g., with backrests). To enable the use of benches even during evenings or nights, it is important to ensure adequate lighting at the site. Additionally, the placement of benches can promote social interaction by being situated in areas where people naturally gather.

Age-friendly: More benches, in consultation with the elderly, contribute an Age-friendly community by ensuring the participation, accessibility, and safety of older adults. The placement of benches at natural gathering spots promotes social interaction and creates an inclusive environment. This results in a better quality of life for the elderly and a more pleasant community for everyone.

Older people can feel safe and welcomed to participate in community life and socialize with others. It also promotes their physical and mental well-being through a pleasant environment and social interaction. Overall, this creates a better quality of life for the elderly and a more inclusive society for all residents.

A systematic approach will be planned for how prioritization should be made.

Age-friendly: By managing slippery conditions and ensuring accessibility in the municipality, a safer environment is created for older adults. It allows for their mobility, increases their independence, and promotes a better quality of life through reduced slip risks and increased social interaction. This contributes to an Age-friendly and inclusive community.

9.5 Planning and monitoring for an Age-friendly municipality

The Elderly and Care Committee is responsible for implementing the action plan for an Age-friendly municipality and thus holds the responsibility for following up and evaluating the action plan according to the process established by the Municipal Executive Committee. The action plan translates identified focus areas into concrete measures, including the responsibilities of each committee and office. It is expected that all offices will report quarterly on the results of their efforts to meet the established goals to the project manager, who will then compile these for the Municipal Executive Committee. The planned actions, initiated by each office, are expected to be carried out within their allocated budget frameworks and should be detailed in the budget submissions for each office.

As part of this process, the units are expected to follow up with a brief report describing the action taken and providing relevant information about it. The reports submitted during quarterly reviews and operational reports will be summarized and forwarded to the Elderly and Care Committee (ÄON). An annual summary of the actions taken for an Age-friendly Municipality will be presented in conjunction with the operational reports to the Municipal Executive Committee (KS).

The Elderly and Care Committee and the Municipal Executive Committee conduct an annual regular review of the action plan. If necessary, the action plan is revised, and a physical follow-up with residents over 65 years old is conducted two years after the plan has been adopted by the committee, in accordance with WHO requirements.



9.6 Vision 2040

The vision for an Age-friendly Municipality in Upplands-Bro by 2040 is to create a lively and active atmosphere where people of all ages can thrive and lead meaningful, active lives.

By working on the action plan to become a more Age-friendly municipality, the goal is to create an environment where both older and younger generations can feel safe, valued, and involved.

Through the expansion of parks, improving safety, implementing accessibility adaptations, and promoting social inclusion, the municipality aims to create a community where people can enjoy outdoor activities, social connections, and togetherness. By offering shared brochures and other resources to combat involuntary loneliness, the municipality strives to build a community culture where no one feels involuntarily isolated. This vision for 2040 seeks to establish a sustainable and inclusive environment where all residents, regardless of age, are given the opportunity to live well and contribute to the community's shared future.
