Section 1 Vision System and Implementation Tasks

1. Vision system

1) Vision

- The vision of the Guri city's elderly-friendly city development plan was derived by reflecting the perspective of active aging in old age, the concept, category, and emphasis of an elderly-friendly city proposed by the WHO, and the direction of a specific urban development plan by area and target to create a livable community such as a healthy city, a safe city, a women-friendly city, and a child-friendly city.
- In addition, reflecting the central elderly social policy, Guri City's municipal vision and policies and conditions for the elderly, Guri Citizens' policy needs for the elderly, the opinions of experts related to elderly policy, and the value pursued by this plan, "Make the life of the elderly high! A city where elderly people can lead independent lives in all areas of their lives, engage in active social participation, and live well for anyone regardless of age.

Aged-friendly governance-based copper community in which all actors voluntarily participate to improve the safe and healthy quality of life of the elderly and copper citizens in all areas of the city, including urban planning, transportation, environment, culture, education, welfare, and medical care.

A route city where the elderly are socially respected and treated and self-realized, such as respect for diversity of the elderly, respect for experience and wisdom of the elderly, respect for independent thinking, decision-making and lifestyle.
