Highlighted Achievements:

1. Establishment of a Public Health Center: The Bueng Yitho Medical and Rehabilitation Center provides accessible healthcare services such as annual health check-ups, medical consultations, and rehabilitation. This is especially beneficial for the elderly and disabled, who face difficulties in traveling to distant medical facilities. The center employs five doctors and a multidisciplinary team, saving both time and expenses for the community.

2. Life Skills Training Project: The municipality established three Elderly Learning and Quality of Life Development Centers. These centers offer life skills training for seniors and individuals with disabilities to enhance daily living skills, such as cooking, mental health care, basic technology usage, and exercise through recreational activities.

3. Development of Public Spaces: Safe and accessible public spaces such as parks, walkways, and other facilities have been developed, creating an environment that fosters the independence of the elderly and disabled.

4. Recreation and Rehabilitation Center: The establishment of the Bueng Yitho Recreation and Rehabilitation Center focuses on physical, mental, and cognitive rehabilitation for the elderly and disabled during daytime hours.

Notable Accomplishments:



1. **Improved Access to Healthcare Services:** The creation of the specialized health center has significantly enhanced medical access for the elderly and disabled in the community, resulting in better overall health outcomes.

2. **Enhanced Quality of Life:** Life skills training programs have enriched the knowledge and abilities of participants, leading to improved self-care and a better quality of life for seniors and the disabled.

3. **Friendly and Safe Environment:** The development of public spaces has created a welcoming and secure environment, allowing all members of the community, especially the elderly and disabled, to live independently and with dignity.

4. **Recognition for Innovative Services:** The "STRONG MODEL" initiative for integrated elderly care won the Healthy Aging Prize for Asean Innovation (HAPI Award) **2021** for its community-driven approach. In addition, the initiative received first place in the Outstanding Health Zone Innovation for Elderly Care at the regional level in 2021.

5. **Finished first for Innovation in Elderly Care Promotion:** In 2021, the Bueng Yitho Elderly Recreation and Rehabilitation Center was recognized as the first runner-up for outstanding elderly care innovation at the regional health zone level.

6. **Accessibility and Inclusivity Rating:** In 2020, the Bueng Yitho Elderly Recreation and Rehabilitation Center received a satisfactory rating for accessibility and inclusivity, ensuring that it caters to the needs of people with disabilities.

Domain 1: Outdoor spaces and building

1. Buildings and Outdoor Areas

1.1 Clean and Well-Maintained Outdoor Areas:

The outdoor spaces and the building exteriors are kept clean. Sidewalks are well-organized, clean, and safe, with designated pedestrian paths specifically for walking. These walkways are non-slip and wide enough to accommodate wheelchairs.





1.2 Organized Indoor Areas:

Indoor spaces are well-organized, with clearly defined functional areas, ensuring easy navigation for elderly and disabled individuals.*



1.3 Adequate Lighting:

Public areas, both indoors and outdoors, are adequately lit during nighttime, providing safety and visibility.



1.4 Safe Activity Spaces:

Areas designated for activities are free from hazards, such as uneven or slippery surfaces, reducing the risk of accidents.





1.5 Parks and Green Spaces:

Public parks and green areas are available for relaxation and recreational use, with accessible paths for elderly and disabled residents.



1.6 Seating Areas for Elderly and Disabled:

Benches and waiting areas are provided in public spaces, ensuring comfort for seniors and people with disabilities.





1.7 Designated Parking Spaces:

Special handicap parking spaces are reserved for elderly and disabled individuals, with clear signage and protection against misuse by non-eligible individuals.



1.8 Signage for Accessibility:

Public buildings and spaces feature clear signage indicating accessible facilities such as ramps, restrooms, and service points for the elderly and disabled.





1.9 Special Service Channels:

Priority service lanes are available for elderly and disabled individuals in public service centers, ensuring efficient and hassle-free access.



1.10 Handrails and Ramps:

Buildings are equipped with ramps, handrails along stairways, and accessible restrooms, ensuring safety and ease of movement for seniors and disabled individuals.





1.11 Non-Slip Walkways:

Outdoor walkways surrounding buildings are wide and non-slip, with handrails installed along steep paths to enhance safety.



1.12 Accessible Public Restrooms: Public restrooms for the elderly and disabled meet national standards, ensuring safety and comfort. The Bueng Yitho Municipality has been awarded the Environmental Health Accreditation (EHA) certification.





Domain 2: Transportation



The Bueng Yitho Town Municipality is located in a peri-urban area, providing convenient transportation access. The main road that passes through the center of the area is Rangsit-Nakhon Nayok Road (National Highway No. 305), which branches off from Phahonyothin Road near Future Park Rangsit. It runs through Bueng Yitho Subdistrict and Thanyaburi District, extending to Ongkharak District in Nakhon Nayok Province and Prachinburi Province. Additionally, Kanchanaphisek Eastern Ring Road (Motorway) cuts through Bueng Yitho Subdistrict, specifically Moo 3 and Moo 4 villages. The road intersects with Rangsit-Nakhon Nayok Road near Wat Moolchindaram Temple, Klong 5.

2.1 Public Transportation Services for the Elderly and Disabled:

Public transportation services are available and designed to cater to the elderly. The community provides buses equipped with ramps and special seating for elderly and disabled individuals. These buses pass through key locations within the community, such as the **Bueng Yitho Medical and Rehabilitation Center**, the **Elderly Quality of Life Development Center**, and other important sites, ensuring that seniors and disabled individuals can travel conveniently.





2.2 Clear Traffic Signs and Intersections:

The area is equipped with clearly visible traffic signs and intersection markers, designed to assist drivers and ensure safe navigation.



2.3 Unobstructed Traffic Routes:

The transportation routes are free from obstructions that could block drivers' vision, ensuring a smooth and safe driving experience.



2.4 Special Parking and Drop-Off Points:



Designated parking spaces and pick-up/drop-off points are available for elderly, disabled, and special-needs individuals, ensuring they have dedicated areas for safe transportation access



2.5 Clean and Well-Maintained Vehicles:

Public vehicles are kept clean and in good condition, ensuring easy boarding and sufficient seating for individuals with special needs



2.6 Informative Signage for Transport Services:

Public transportation services provide clear, accessible information about prices, routes, schedules, and special services for the elderly and disabled.





2.7 Safe Boarding Practices by Drivers:*

Drivers ensure that buses stop at designated points, aligning closely with the curb to facilitate easy boarding for elderly and disabled passengers. They also ensure passengers are seated before driving off.



2.8 Continuous Driver Training and Vehicle Maintenance:

Drivers undergo regular training on driving techniques and vehicle maintenance, with collaboration from private sector partners to ensure safety and efficiency.



2.9 Supplementary Transportation Services*

In cases where regular public transportation is insufficient, the municipality provides supplementary transport services. This includes special transportation for disabled individuals and seniors attending the Bueng Yitho Recreation and Rehabilitation Center.



2.10 Affordable Hired Vehicles*

The community provides hired vehicles with reasonable fares, ensuring affordability for seniors and disabled individuals.



2.11 Well-Maintained Roads and Public Lighting:

Roads are regularly maintained to ensure smooth conditions, and there are adequate streetlights installed for nighttime safety.





Domain 3: Housing

3.1 Safe and Stable Housing for Seniors and Disabled Individuals:

Residential homes are safe and stable, with features that accommodate the needs of the elderly and disabled. For example, floors are non-slip, walkways are free from obstacles, and bathrooms are equipped with handrails to ensure safety.



3.2 Clean and Well-Maintained Rental Properties:

Both public and private rental housing is clean, well-maintained, and safe, providing appropriate living environments for elderly and disabled tenants.



3.3 Affordable Housing for the Elderly

There is an adequate supply of affordable housing options for seniors, ensuring they have access to safe and comfortable living spaces at reasonable costs.



3.4 Clean Residential Environment:

The surroundings of homes are kept clean and free from stagnant water or breeding grounds for disease-carrying pests and insects.



3.5 Accessible Bathrooms:

Bathrooms in residential homes are equipped with seated toilets (flush toilets) and handrails, ensuring ease of use and safety for elderly and disabled residents.



3.6 Barrier-Free Interior Design:

Homes feature spacious, accessible living areas, with level flooring and pathways that are free from barriers, allowing easy movement for residents.





3.7 Annual Risk Assessments for Housing:

Regular risk assessments are conducted at least once a year to evaluate and address any necessary modifications to homes, ensuring they are suitable for elderly residents.



3.8 Home Modification Services for Seniors:

Services are provided to modify and improve existing homes to meet the needs of elderly residents, adapting them to be more accessible and safer.

Hotels and resorts offer accommodation that is affordable, appropriate, and ensures safety for elderly individuals. For example, rooms are designed with non-slip floors, sufficient lighting, and facilities that provide convenience and security, such as accessible bathrooms and emergency support systems.





Domain 4: Social Participation

4.1 Activities and events are scheduled at convenient times for seniors, allowing them to participate.



Example: Organizing field trips for seniors to travel off-site.



4.2 Information regarding activities, travel details, and accessibility are provided to the elderly.

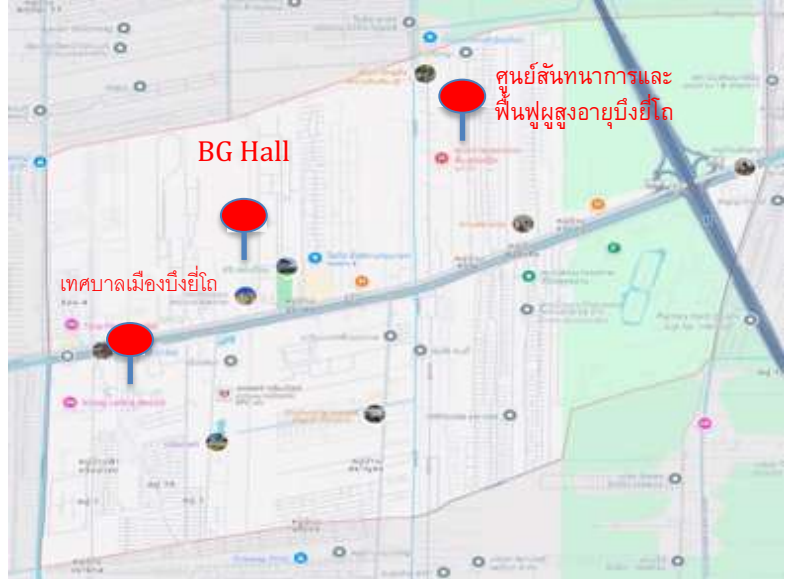

4.6 There is a variety of activities that appeal to different groups of seniors, encouraging their participation.





4.7 There is encouragement for isolated seniors or those at risk of loneliness to join community activities.

Example: Off-site learning activities, such as taking seniors to Wat Arun Ratchawaram Ratchawaramahawihan (Buddhist temple) as part of a project focused on senior engagement in parks. The goal is to enhance their potential and skills, promoting social intelligence and helping them understand others, express themselves appropriately, and develop social interaction and communication skills. This enables seniors to adapt and live harmoniously with others.

5.1 Services and products meet the diverse needs and preferences of seniors.





5.2 Activities are promoted for all age groups, providing opportunities for seniors to participate, including family members.

5.3 Seniors are acknowledged and honored for their contributions, both past and present, mainly through public recognition events and awards.





5.4 Seniors are encouraged to share their knowledge, experiences, history, and expertise (e.g., local wisdom) with younger generations in the community.

Example: Traditional Songkran water-pouring ceremony to honor and recognize the elderly.



5.5 Stories of exemplary seniors who serve as role models in various aspects of life are shared to the public through social media such as Line, Facebook, etc.

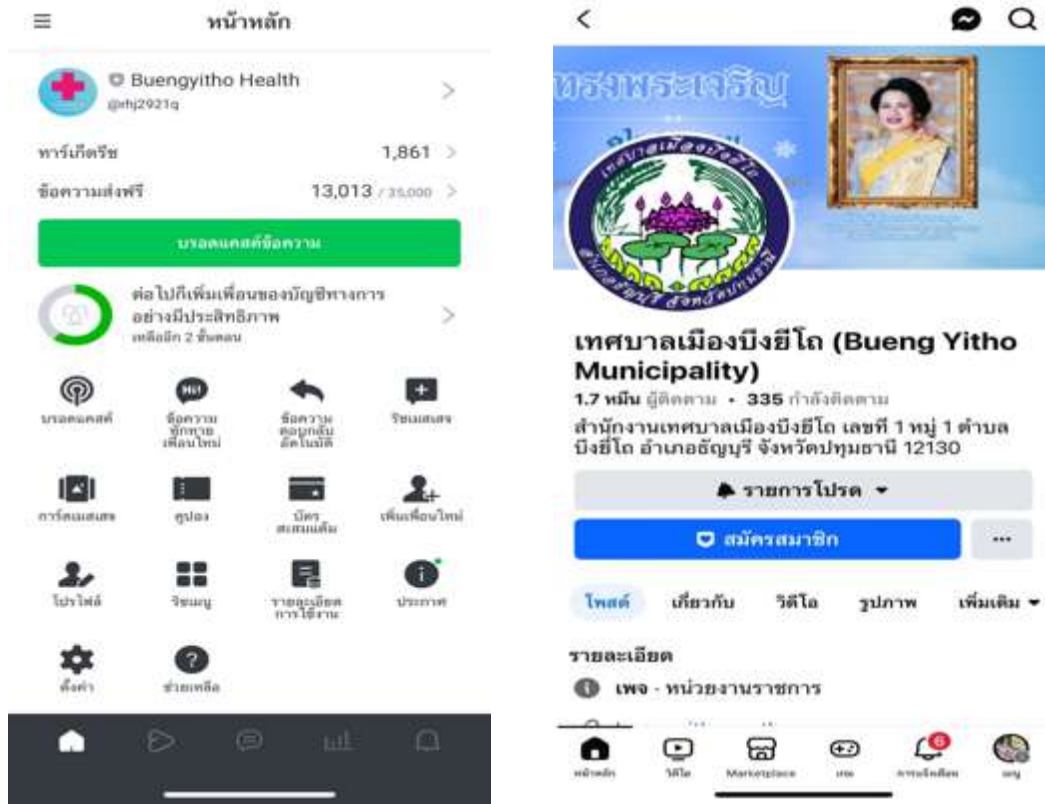

Example: Bueng Yitho opened applications for positions such as nursing assistants, security guards, janitors, and other positions suitable for older adults. The municipality has also hired them as speakers with appropriate compensation.





Domain 7: Communication and information

7.1 A communication system and basic information sharing are designed to be accessible to all age groups in the community.



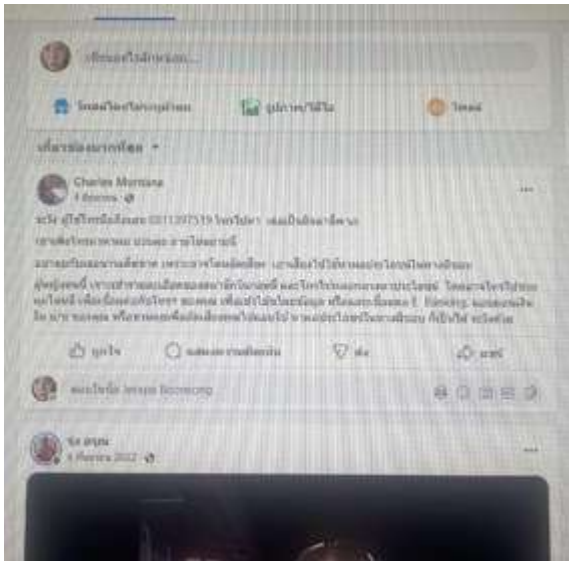


7.2 Information is regularly and reliably disseminated, with coordination networks and accessible communication centers.

7.7 Electronic devices like ticket dispensers, radios, televisions, ATMs, and vending machines have large buttons and easy-to-understand instructions.

ที่มาและความสำคัญ

ปัญหาขยะเป็นปัญหาระดับโลก การเพิ่มปริมาณขยะส่งผลกระทบต่อสิ่งแวดล้อมและสุขภาพของประชาชน การรีไซเคิลขยะเป็นกระบวนการที่สามารถช่วยลดปริมาณขยะที่ฝังกลบได้ ช่วยลดการปล่อยก๊าซเรือนกระจก และช่วยประหยัดพลังงานในการผลิตสินค้าใหม่

8.5 Support for research and innovation related to health promotion and environmental health for older adults is encouraged to improve their overall health.

Project: Pocket Parks – small public parks designed for people of all ages, considering space limitations in urban areas, to encourage physical exercise. These parks have nine exercise stations targeting four areas of development:

1. Balance training
2. Leg muscle strengthening
3. Arm/leg flexibility
4. Muscle development and concentration.

The Bueng Yitho Municipality has implemented Pocket Parks in the community and continues to search for innovations to improve the overall physical, mental, social, and environmental well-being of the community. The equipment is also developed in collaboration with Thammasat University.





Product: HAIDEE – an innovation mimicking HOCl, a substance produced by white blood cells to fight infections and inflammation. It inhibits the growth of bacteria and viruses by up to 99.99%. Research also shows that HOCl can block Interleukin-6 (IL-6), reducing the risk of cytokine storms and chronic wounds. Clinical reports from Haidee Co. have conducted research comparing recovery periods in patients with pressure ulcers and diabetic wounds, in collaboration with the Bueng Yitho Medical and Rehabilitation Center.

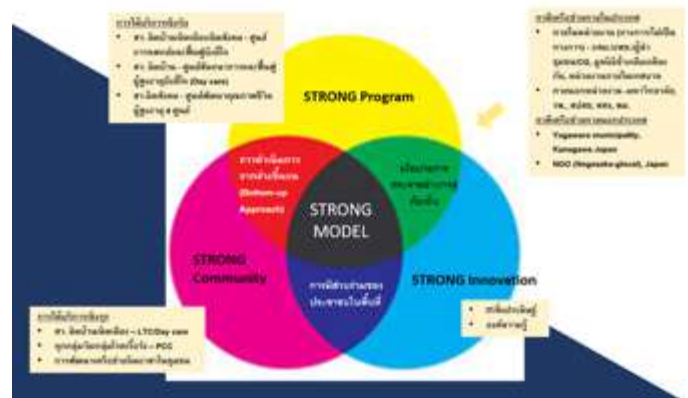




8.6 Communities are encouraged to watch for environmental health risks for older adults.

Project: Dementia support activities in a Dementia Café, a concept inspired by Japan. The café provides a supportive space for people with dementia and their caregivers to socialize, share knowledge, and relax, while caregivers also receive emotional support. The Bueng Yitho Municipality, in collaboration with Thammasat University's Faculty of Social Work, adopted this model under the name "Strong Café" to provide care for dementia patients in the area.
