1. Save the Microsoft Word-based document (WHO FCTC reporting instrument) to a folder on the computer that will be used to complete the questionnaire.

2. Ensure your Microsoft Word security settings allow you to run macros in this document:

(i) Under the "Tools" menu, select "Macro".

(ii) In the "Macro" menu, select "Security".

(iii) In the "Security" pop up menu, please ensure that you have selected "Medium".

3. Close and re-open the WHO FCTC reporting instrument (Microsoft Word-based document which you saved to your computer under step 1).

4. As the document is opening, a box will appear asking if you want to enable macros. The answer is yes. Click "Enable macros".

5. Once you have clicked "Enable macros", the buttons indicating that you can add new rows or new categories to the tables provided will be functional.

If you use a newer version of Microsoft Word:

1. When receiving the security warning "Some active content has been disabled", click "Enable content".

2. When receiving another security warning "Macros have been disabled", click "Enable content".

	The Government of Barbados continue to provide support for tobacco control through the Senior Medical Officer of Health with responsibility for NCDs and the Health Promotion Unit. During the last two years, steps were taken to prepare legislation adopting the Regional Standard on Packaging & Labelling of Tobacco Products as the National Standard. Efforts are on-going in collaboration with the Office of The Attorney General to enact legislation to give effect to the Standard. In addition, an amendment to the Health Services Act is being prepared to provide for the e-cigarette to be regulated under this Act, as is the case with other tobacco products.

5. PRIORITIES AND COMMENTS

5.1	What are the priorities for implementation of the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control in your jurisdiction?
	Priorities for implementation of the FCTC are enactment of legislation for packaging and labelling of tobacco products. This process has been started and it is expected that legislation will be brought to the Parliament by the end of 2014. In addition, legislation to regulate the e-cigarette is also being prepared. The Cabinet of Barbados has agreed that e-cigarettes should be treated as the standard tobacco products, including provisions for increased taxation, regulations banning smoking in public places and the sale of tobacco to minors. Given the pervasiveness of the internet and social media which influence behavioural patterns in-country, Barbados is interested in working with regional partners to develop a regional protocol to govern tobacco advertising, promotion and sponsorship in accordance with Article 13. The Ministry of Health is exploring the feasibility of establishing a national coordinating mechanism to administer tobacco control policies. Specifically, the Ministry of Health needs input form the Ministry of Finance and the Customs and Excise Department to develop a position on the Protocol on Illicit Trade in Tobacco, given its complex nature. The Ministry of Health would welcome technical assistance from PAHO in this respect. Barbados if fully supportive of the implementation of the FCTC and will continue to work to implement its provisions and to participate in all regional and international fora on tobacco control. Barbados is also committed to the work of the COP to set the agenda for global tobacco control; however, a request is made for consideration of funding to support such country participation. Barbados will continue to be a regional leader in tobacco prevention and control and the Government is giving consideration to hosting a sub-regional meeting on taxation and other demand reduction strategies in collaboration with PAHO.
