The main reasons for this development are a number of tobacco tax increases in that period and restrictions in sale of tobacco products to minors. Representative data on water pipe usage among youths is only available for 2007 and 2008. Water pipe usage has not changed substantially in these two years. There has been only a slight decrease in the 1-month-prevalence: from 16.3% to 14% among boys (age 12-17) and from 11.5% to 10.4% among girls (age 12-17).
