The National Committee for Tobacco Control (created in 2000) had received a task of prepering a National Tobacco Control Act. This Act was approved by the National Assembly and came in to force since 16 August 2009. The bill is comprehensive and largely compliaint with the FCTC requiremnets include; 1) total ban in all enclosed public places, work places, public transports, 2) total ban on advertising, sponsorship and promotion, 3) requirement for health warnings on tobacco packets, 4) ban of sales by/to minors, 5) provisions on illicit trade 6) seeting up of national tobacco control board and many others. Related regulations are under development currently. Several sensitization programs have been organised since several years- The total ban in enlosed public and work places has been very well implemented.
