In 2006, 50,7% of males and 16,6 of females who are 18 years old and over were smoking cigarette. In 2008, 49,5% of males and 15,9 of females who are 18 years old and over were smoking cigarette. So, ratio of tobacco use for both sexes is declining in Turkey between the years 2006 and 2008.

On the other hand, smoking in water pipes (2,3%) is an emerging form of tobacco use in Turkey, especially among young adults. Use of water pipe was highest for men age 15-24 (8,1%) and those living in urban areas (4,9%).

No matter what the purpose may be, all forms of announcement or advertisement of tobacco products in the media using the product name, logo or trademark are strictly prohibited;

Tobacco products may not be displayed on television programmes, films, television series, music videos, advertisements and commercial films, and their images may not be used.

Tobacco products may not be sold in health, education and training, culture and sports facilities.

Tobacco products shall not be sold or offered for use to minors under 18 years of age.

Minors under 18 shall not be employed in tobacco companies or tobacco marketing or sales activities.

Tobacco products aren't sold individually, in open packs or in smaller packs.

Tobacco products aren't sold in via dispensers or electronic shopping media such as telephone or internet except by authorized dealers and aren't shipped by cargo with the aim of selling the products.

Chewing gum, sweets, treats, toys, clothes, jewellery, accessories and like products shall not be produced, distributed or sold in any way suggestive of a tobacco product or tobacco brand.

- TAPDK's Legal Office has been prompted, after necessary determinations, for litigation against a total of 31 (thirty-one) retailers (48 retailers in 2009) who were understood to sell tobacco products to minors under 18 between 01/01/2010 and 30/04/2010. The litigation grounds are Para 8 of Article 3 of the Law 4207 on Prevention and Control of Harms of Tobacco Products as amended by Law 5727 and Para 6 of Article 8 ("Penalty Clauses") of the said Law: "Infringement of the prohibitions set forth in Para 8 of Article 3 shall be penalized as per the provision of Article 194 ("Provision of substances hazardous for health") of the Turkish Penal Code 5237 dated 26/9/2004.
- Secondary legislation arrangements related to the provision in Article 3(13) of the Law 4207 are under way.
