	The difference between the distribution of smoking among men and women is evident. Apparently, the so called historical tendencies of spreading of smoking among sexes have not changed in Georgia so far, due to which among women positive, and among men extremely negative results are maintained. It also has to be taken into consideration that women's smoking is still a stigmatized subject and it is presumable, that some women keep this habit secret. As a result the received indicator may not reflect accurately the real situation. Nevertheless, there is a slight trend of dicrease of smoking in the figures provided in the current report compared to the figures shown in the previous country report of 2008; in avarage current results show in avarage 4% less prevalence of smoking in both sexes.
