GYTS 2001 Data were collected in the towns of Montevideo, Maldonado, Rivera and Colonia. The study was administered to students aged from 13 to 15 studying in the Basic Intermediate cycle (1st, 2nd and 3rd years). 24% of them said that they were currently smokers, with consumption being highest among girls. 8% of the total smoked more than 20 days a month, a figure which doubled among 3rd year basic intermediate students. The age at which they started smoking was between 12 and 13. The data from the GYTS are now being analysed.

The summary of the 2nd National Survey on Drug Consumption among intermediate-level students (age 13 to 17), who make up 60% of this age group, is available. Several features of consumption were identified, one of which is presented below. The data have not (yet) been broken down by sex, which is why it was not possible to include them in the section on

prevalence among youth. Generally speaking, there has been a drop in habitual tobacco use. However, females make up a significantly higher proportion than males. The data were collected in 2005.

Definitions: Current smoker: used during last 30 days

Current smoker 13 to 17 years cigarettes 2005 24.8%

In comparison with the data for 2001 (30.2%) for the same group, there has been a decline in consumption. This is also true of those who smoked at all during the previous twelve months, who were also covered by the survey.
