Individual passengers should complete a form on arrival and declare any goods that exceed the prescribed personal allowance. (See the section on Article 6 of this report.) In addition to the control of goods imported by arriving passengers, there is a system of notification covering any means of transport or cargo arriving in Fiji. Customs officers ensure that the above-mentioned provisions of the Customs Act are efficiently administered, while risk management and profiling have greatly assisted customs in identifying illegal activities and enhancing the facilitation of trade. The Fiji Revenue and Customs Service (FRCS) analyses information contained in advance notifications and acts as necessary, including searching vessels and imposing fines if there is proof beyond doubt that provisions of the customs legislation have been contravened.
