



Background of Resource Database



- At its Eighth Session in 2018, the Conference of the Parties (COP8) to the WHO FCTC urged Parties adopted a decision requesting the Convention Secretariat to establish a resource database—through or with support from the Knowledge Hub for Article 5.3—containing evidence-based information such as industry policy submissions, funded groups, and data from Parties, observatories, WHO, and COP observers.
- The Convention Secretariat, in collaboration with the WHO FCTC Knowledge Hub for Article 5.3 (formerly the Global Center for Good Governance in Tobacco Control), developed this Resource Database.
- **Objective:** The Resource Database aims to be the one-stop platform for Parties to submit documents relating tobacco industry entities includes the large transnationals and the entities funded by the tobacco industry or furthering its interests.
- Target users: WHO FCTC Focal Points who will facilitate the exchange of information from and to their own jurisdictions. Other users include government officials involved in WHO FCTC implementation, tobacco control advocates, policymakers, etc.

Tobacco industry submissions

Upload tobacco industry documents

Contribute to this evolving repository by uploading tobacco industry related data available in your country.



Submissions by tobacco-related entities

Find here submissions by organizations and individuals that work to further the interests of the tobacco industry.










Search by topic





Accessing the data



The documents, with the lock icon against their titles, are the ones that are tagged by the contributor as "restricted access" and can only be downloaded and shared by focal points and government officials. All other documents can be downloaded and shared by the general public.

Focal points will be able to register themselves to this database using the "log in" button situated on the top of the global resource database platform.

Note: All registrations are subject to verification.

How can it help monitor tobacco industry?

Regulatory requirement

Such as registration detail of tobacco entities, supply chain activity, product practices, product regulations, packaging & labeling, market data including novel & emerging products.

TI marketing tactic

Such as marketing expenditures & strategies, CSR activities and lobbying contributions

Resource Database

Tobacco industry front groups and allies

Group supporting the tobacco industry or funded by it.

Others

Data to support litigation or legal claim made by the TI including liability evidence

Resource Database on Tobacco Industry Interference

Resource Database is a tool designed to collect and share information and documents related to the tobacco industry, supporting Parties, civil society, and public health efforts.

It helps monitor tobacco industry tactics and interference efforts at the policy level, directly contributing to the implementation of WHO FCTC Article 5.3.

Additionally, it supports the implementation of **Article 19 (Liability),** which addresses the tobacco industry's responsibility, including compensation, and **Article 20 (Exchange of Information)**, which focuses on establishing and strengthening surveillance for tobacco control and promoting information exchange in relevant fields.


Challenges remain in promoting and raising awareness among Parties to submit tobacco industry-related documents, as well as in overcoming translation limitations.




