

- A set of globally standardized surveys
- Systematically monitor youth and adult tobacco use and key tobacco control indicators
- Monitor tobacco use and tobacco prevention and control interventions
- Closely linked with both WHO's Framework Convention on Tobacco Control [FCTC] and MPOWER measures





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

GYTS Overview


- Global standard for systematically monitoring youth tobacco use
- Nationally representative school-based survey of youth age 13 to 15 years old
- Generate comparable data within and across countries
- Standard, systematic and consistent process for all countries



GYTS Topics Covered


- Knowledge and attitudes (cigarettes)
- Prevalence (cigarette and other tobacco use)
- New and emerging tobacco products (electronic cigarettes)
- Role of the media and advertising in students' use of cigarettes
- Access to cigarettes
- Tobacco-related school curriculum
- Second-hand tobacco smoke exposure
- Cessation (cigarettes)

GYTS 1999-2018: Active in 188 Countries/Sites



- One of the largest public health surveillance system ever developed and maintained
- Repeated 2nd round in 151 countries, 3rd in 116, 4th in 52 countries, and 5th in 5 countries

GYTS Monitoring Current Cigarette Smoking



^{*}Current cigarette smoking is defined as smoking cigarettes on at least 1 day during the past 30 days





GATS Overview


- Global standard for systematically monitoring adult tobacco use
- Nationally representative household survey of adults aged >15 years older
- Generate comparable data within and across countries
- Standard, systematic and consistent process for all countries



GATS Topics Covered

- Tobacco use prevalence (smoking and smokeless tobacco products)
- New and emerging tobacco products (electronic cigarettes)
- Second-hand tobacco smoke exposure and policies
- Cessation
- Knowledge, attitudes and perceptions
- Exposure to pro and anti-tobacco media
- Economics

GATS 2008-2018: Active in 34 Countries




- GATS is implemented in 34 countries representing more than 70% of the world's adult population
- Repeated 2nd round in 11 countries, 3rd round in 1 country.

^{*}Exposure to secondhand smoke in the work place is defined as being exposed to smoke in indoor areas at work during the past 30 days



TQS Overview

Objective: To provide sustainable monitoring of tobaccouse and key policy measures

What: Key tobacco questions for inclusion in national and international surveys of adults

- Questions on smoking prevalence (3 questions)
- Questions covering key MPOWER topics (19 questions)

Selection Options: Based on country preference



Outcome: Enhancement of global monitoring, comparability, pool of reliable data

		Q2a. Past daily smoking status (for current less than daily smokers)	Former Daily Tobacco Smokers (Among All Adults) Percentage of respondents who are ever daily tobacco smokers and currently do not smoke tobacco.
		Q2b. Past smoking status (for current non-smokers)	
			Former Daily Tobacco Smokers (Among Ever Daily Smokers) Percentage of ever daily tobacco smokers who currently do not smoke tobacco.


TQS Implementation 2008-2018



- Heated tobacco products, or "heat-not-burn," questions for GYTS and GATS
- Continued surveillance efforts among youth and adults using GYTS and GATS
 - When GYTS or GATS cannot be implemented, integrated TQS and TQS-Youth
- Tobacco Industry monitoring
- Continued distribution of Treatment & Beyond and other resources for health care providers to enhance capacity for cessation
- Continued Data to Action trainings for translation of GTSS data into enhanced tobacco control
