
Prevalence among

■ Highest in the Region







Laws and regulations

- Public Health Law No. 47 of 2008,(Amended in 2017). Chapter 12, is the primary piece of tobacco control legislation in Jordan and addresses smoke free places, tobacco advertising and promotion, and tobacco packaging and labeling. It also provides penalties for violations of these provisions.

Water pipe status

- In January 2014, an amendment occurred to the law regulation for molasses were adopted .
- the Greater Amman Municipality announced it would neither renew licenses nor issue new ones for restaurants and cafes to serve argileh. All licenses expire on March 31-2014.

- The restaurants gave period of time to correct their situation , and the municipality started issuing tickets and . They reported the closer of 22 shops for not implementing the 50% separation .
- They visited 121 shop ticketed 52 and gave warning to other 20 .
- According to Amman municipality there is 300 licensed shops



Major challenges in Jordan

- Illegal coffee shops that serve water pipe without licensing.
- Low prices for the products
- Easy access
- Cultural acceptance
- Wrong believe that smoking water pipe is less harmful than smoking cigarettes
