

# Tajikistan

## 2006 Fact Sheet



The **2006 Tajikistan GSHS** measured alcohol and other drug use; sexual behaviours that contribute to HIV infections, other STIs, and unintended pregnancies; unintentional injuries and violence; tobacco use; and mental health.

The 2006 Tajikistan GSHS was a school-based survey of students in forms 7, 8, and 9. A two-stage cluster sample design was used to produce data representative of all students in forms 7, 8, and 9 in Tajikistan. At the first stage, schools were selected with probability proportional to enrollment size. At the second stage, classes were randomly selected and all students in selected classes were eligible to participate. The school response rate was 99%, the student response rate was 81%, and the overall response rate was 80%. A total of 9,714 students participated in the Tajikistan GSHS. Students self-reported their responses to each question on a computer scannable answer sheet. For comparison purposes, only students aged 13-15 years are included in the analyses for this fact sheet.
