



Trinidad & Tobago (Tobago)

2017 Fact Sheet

The 2017 Trinidad & Tobago (Tobago) GSHS was a school-based survey of students in Forms 1-6, which are typically attended by students aged 13-17. A two-stage cluster sample design was used to produce data representative of all students in Forms 1-6 in Trinidad & Tobago (Tobago). At the first stage, schools were selected with probability proportional to enrollment size. At the second stage, classes were randomly selected and all students in selected classes were eligible to participate.

The Trinidad & Tobago (Tobago) GSHS measured alcohol use; dietary behaviors; drug use; hygiene; mental health; physical activity; protective factors; sexual behaviors; tobacco use; and violence and unintentional injury. Students self-reported their responses to each question on a computer scannable answer sheet.

The school response rate was 100%, the student response rate was 89%, and the overall response rate was 89%. A total of 1,033 students participated in the Trinidad & Tobago (Tobago) GSHS. Prevalence estimates (percentages) and 95% confidence intervals are presented below.
