

# Uruguay (Montevideo)

## 2012 Fact Sheet



The **2012 Uruguay (Montevideo) GSHS** measured alcohol use; dietary behaviors; drug use; hygiene; mental health; physical activity; protective factors; sexual behaviors; tobacco use; and violence and unintentional injury.

The Uruguay (Montevideo) GSHS was a school-based survey of students in grades 2 CB, 3 CB, and 1 BD. A two-stage cluster sample design was used to produce data representative of all students in grades 2 CB, 3 CB, and 1 BD in Uruguay (Montevideo). At the first stage, schools were selected with probability proportional to enrollment size. At the second stage, classes were randomly selected and all students in selected classes were eligible to participate. The school response rate was 100%, the student response rate was 77%, and the overall response rate was 77%. A total of 1721 students participated in the Uruguay (Montevideo) GSHS. Students self-reported their responses to each question on a computer-scannable answer sheet. For comparison purposes, only students aged 13-15 years are included in the analyses for this fact sheet.
