



## Bolivia Plains

### 2018 Fact Sheet

The 2018 Bolivia Plains GSHS was a school-based survey of students in 2nd Secondary - 6th Secondary, which are typically attended by students aged 13-17. A two-stage cluster sample design was used to produce data representative of all students in 2nd Secondary - 6th Secondary in Bolivia Plains. At the first stage, schools were selected with probability proportional to enrollment size. At the second stage, classes were randomly selected and all students in selected classes were eligible to participate.

The Bolivia Plains GSHS measured alcohol use; drug use; hygiene; mental health; physical activity; protective factors; sexual behaviors; and violence and unintentional injury. Students self-reported their responses to each question on a computer scanable answer sheet.

The school response rate was 97%, the student response rate was 83%, and the overall response rate was 80%. A total of 2,851 students participated in the Bolivia Plains GSHS. Prevalence estimates (percentages) and 95% confidence intervals are presented below.
