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#### **Procurement at WHO**

- Procurement at WHO: "All actions necessary for the acquisition, by purchase or lease, of real property, goods, works or professional services."
- Until 2019 WHO procured approx. \$800 Million annually, however almost doubled in 2020 to \$1.7 Billion due to the emergency COVID'19 response and 2021 was again almost \$1.7 Billion
- Top categories purchased: medical equipment, management services, laboratory and testing equipment, research services, pharmaceuticals.
- Global supplier base: in 2021, +15,000 different suppliers used from 180 countries
- Policy aligned with UN/public procurement and 5 key principles: best value for money; fairness, integrity and transparency; effective competition; interest of WHO; sustainable procurement
- Key procurement systems used: UNGM and In-Tend (e-Tendering), new ERP being designed
- Procurement is largely decentralized to offices with delegated authority, with differences in strategies followed for goods vs services:
  - Goods: mainly leveraging catalogues set up through Long Term Agreements (LTAs) with suppliers
  - Services: mainly led by Technical Experts in Requesting Units (ROs, HQ)








## Profile of our procurement spend

#### Total procurement spend 2017 – 2021










## Profile of our procurement spend - goods

#### Procurement spend on goods 2021











## Goods procurement through long-term agreements

#### Spend on goods in 2021 using long-term agreements







- Compliance with the UN Supplier Code of Conduct is a pre-requisite
- Compliance with other WHO policies including Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct (ii) WHO Policy on Sexual Exploitation and Abuse Prevention and Response (iii) WHO policy on Preventing and Addressing Abusive Conduct (iv) the WHO Code of Conduct for Responsible Research (v) the WHO Policy on Whistleblowing and Protection Against Retaliation.
- You may want to read WHO general terms and conditions of the contract any contracted suppliers need to effectively comply
- We encourage action of manufacturers and suppliers of pharmaceuticals, other chemicals, medical devices, diagnostic products, cold chain items:
  - on establishing road maps toward zero emissions in production, packaging, and transportation,
  - to produce products that are energy efficient, safe, reusable, and recyclable
