
Overview of the UNDP-Global Fund Partnership

The UNDP-Global Fund Partnership makes a significant contribution to UNDP's Strategic Plan, the HIV, Health & Development (HHD) Strategy Note; the Sustainable Development Goals and the pledge to leave no one behind.

The partnership has evolved since 2002, but focuses on **three action areas**:

- supporting grant implementation in challenging operating environments:
- strengthening the capacity of national partners in line with UNDP's mandate to help build resilient and sustainable health systems; and
- leveraging UNDP's policy expertise to promote human rights, gender equality and other measures to increase equitable access to services.

In all three action areas, UNDP draws on **strategic partnerships** with governments, civil society organizations, donors, UN agencies, academia and the private sector to deliver results in a way that respects national ownership, and promotes aid effectiveness and sustainability.

PSM Architecture

- ✓ UNDP's Global Health Procurement Centre provides end-to-end specialized services to countries across all aspects of procurement, supply chain management based on the principles of best value for money, fairness, transparency, and quality
- ✓ UNDP's centralized procurement model enables it to leverage volume commitments to deliver economies of scale, competitive prices and favorable delivery timeframes.
- ✓ UNDP's **long-term agreements with suppliers** of health products enables it to provide timely and reliable delivery of quality-assured products.
- ✓ UNDP centralized quality assurance (QA) team ensure medicines and medical devices comply with UNDP's QA policy, which is aligned with WHO, Global Fund and other International Organizations and regulatory standards.
- ✓ UNDP has extensive experience providing capacity building support to strengthen national institutions, systems and processes in collaboration with implementing partners.
- ✓ UNDP can leverage its strategic partnerships with key UN partners and Development Banks – UNICEF, UNFPA, UNOPS/Stop TB/GDF, WHO, UNAIDS, UNHCR, World Bank












Transition examples - Ukraine



Partnership between UNDP and MOH of Ukraine. UNDP has procured USD 620 million worth of medicines and health products, covering 26 programs and provided technical assistance. <u>USD 66 M – calculated savings!!!</u>










UNDP Health PSM - Key facts














UNDP Health Procurement volumes 2016 - 2021

Health Procurement Operating Model


- Procurement team: sourcing and procurement activities with Health product QA oversight supported with consultants in medical devices and lab
- Pool of PSM specialists to provide technical support and advisory services to PMU in CO with extended expert support through a roster of consultants covering a full range of subject matters for health products management and supply chain management for management and capacity development
- E-support: Online operational guidance, tools and training & certification (e.g. CIPS)
