




Top 10 most demanded SRH **Commodities**



പ്പാ Payment methods and alternatives

- Currently, advance payment methods according to Financial Regulations and Rules (FRR 15.3)
- · Exceptionally, other payment terms may be approved by the Chief Procurement Official (FRR 15.3. c)

Accelerating the development and implementation of multiple alternative Financial Solutions

- Deferred payment based on a bank guarantee with standby letter of credit
- Introduction of a Financial Facility for TPP (Pilot Bridging Mechanism)
- 3 Financial Facility for UNFPA Supplies Partnership countries
- Collaboration with supplier and other UN Agencies










Pilot Financial Facility implemented in 2020-2022



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- What was it? Short term financing facility for procurement to national partners using their own domestic resources
- Who could benefit? Governments <u>unable to</u> <u>pay upfront</u> or have long fund disbursement process
- Partners must meet a number of eligibility conditions
- What for? Procurement of SRH supplies from UNFPA.









How it worked?

UNFPA

Initial Procurement Request and Application review

- Request for Proforma Invoice
- Proforma issued by UNFPA
- Assessment of application
- => Approval granted
- Purchase Order issued



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Participating organization pays

- Shipment receipt
- Payment of Final Invoice

Participant Organization



Production of Orders

- Goods manufactured
- Cargo is shipped
- Final Invoice issued

Results of Pilot Financial Facility (2020-2022)



Financial solutions

Lesotho, Honduras and Chile in numbers.



14 different commodities

were procured such as contraceptive pills, IUDs, implants, pregnancy tests or medical devices



USD 4.07 million

total worth of 19 proforma invoices



USD 1.59 million

approximately in savings for these three countries



1,028,492 CYP

estimated couple of years protection







Case of Lesotho - Ministry of Health



Lower middle-income country of 2.2 Million inhabitants.

Not possible to obtain economies of scale with local procurement exercise

Procurement of 3 contraceptives (pills, injectables and implants)

Previous procurement costs: USD 2,520,000

Procurement through UNFPA: <u>USD 255,000</u>

Savings obtained via UNFPA
 USD 2.265,000 => Savings of 89.9%







Case of Lesotho - Ministry of Health





Estimated additional Impact IF the savings of USD 2,265,000 where reinvested in SRH:

Product diversion in the supply chain

 Unauthorized or illicit distribution of pharmaceuticals to private markets

Impacts:

- Quality of pharmaceuticals
- Procurer budgets
- Patient safety
- Destroys the private market distribution
- Reputational risk of manufacturer and UNFPA

ICA Verifications and Escalation of Findings

- Noncompliance with given standards are directly addressed through on-site mentoring and subsequent recommendations
- Potential irregularities are assessed during the on-site visit facility verifications, yet analysis and investigation of these is under the purview of UNFPA's OAIS

Reporting Action Finding LMA reports to UNFPA's Potential irregularities Office Office of Audit and identified through the Investigation Services (OAIS) for analysis and LMA process eventual investigation







UNFPA New Service Conditions for external partners

- •UNFPA may conduct inspections, audits and investigations related to the Procurement Service Contract.
- •The customer shall grant access to UNFPA to their premises including warehouses, personnel and relevant documentation.
- •The customer shall reasonably cooperate with any audits or investigations carried out by UNFPA.
