WHO PUBLIC ASSESSMENT REPORT (WHOPAR)

[MA081 trade name]*

Artesunate/Amodiaquine 50/135 mg Tablets

[MA081 trade name], manufactured at Ipca Laboratories Ltd, Silvassa, Dadra and Nagar Haveli, India was included in the WHO list of prequalified medicinal products for the treatment of malaria on 1 June 2012.

[MA081 trade name] is a so called artemisinin-based combination therapy (ACT) indicated for the treatment of uncomplicated cases of malaria due to *Plasmodium falciparum* strains which are susceptible to amodiaquine as well as to artesunate. Detailed information on the use of this product is described in the summary of product characteristics (SmPC), which can be found in this WHOPAR.

The active pharmaceutical ingredients of [MA081 trade name] are the artemisinin derivative artesunate and the 4-aminoquinoline amodiaquine.

The efficacy and safety profile of [MA081 trade name] is well established based on extensive clinical experience in the treatment of malaria.

On the basis of data submitted and public information on the use of [MA081 trade name] in malaria, the team of assessors advised that [MA081 trade name] is of acceptable quality, efficacy and safety to allow inclusion of [MA081 trade name] in the list of prequalified medicinal products.
