WHO PUBLIC ASSESSMENT REPORT (WHOPAR)

[TB392 trade name]*

Isoniazid 300 mg tablets

[TB392 trade name], manufactured at Svizera Labs Private Limited, Turbhe, Navi Mumbai, India, was included in the WHO list of prequalified medicinal products for the treatment of tuberculosis on 22 December 2023.

[TB392 trade name] is currently indicated in combination with other tuberculosis medicines for the treatment and prevention of tuberculosis due to *Mycobacterium tuberculosis*. Detailed information on the use of this product is described in the summary of product characteristics (SmPC), which can be found in this WHOPAR.

The active pharmaceutical ingredient of [TB392 trade name] is isoniazid.

The efficacy and safety of isoniazid are well established based on extensive clinical experience in the treatment and prevention of tuberculosis.

For details on the uses of this product and for side effects and warnings, see Part 4 of this WHOPAR (summary of product characteristics).

On the basis of data submitted and public information on the use of isoniazid, the team of assessors advised that [TB392 trade name] is of acceptable quality, efficacy and safety to allow inclusion of [TB392 trade name] in the list of prequalified medicinal products.
