


Guidance for JRA online training enrolment and access

This detailed guidance aims at helping new JRA learners to access the online training course. Some steps may appear slightly differently depending on your browser. The steps presented below were conducted on Internet Explorer and Google Chrome.


- 1- Click the link to access the WHO website:

You will get the below screen.



- 2- Scroll down the page and click on *Continue* button




- 3- The below window will appear. Click on *Register*.



- 4- A new screen will appear asking to enter your mail address. Once done, tick the box *I'm not a robot*, and click the red button *Next* → to continue the process.


- 5- A new window may appear (not necessarily) asking for review permissions, click Accept.

- 6- You will be directed to the WHO login webpage as shown below. Click *External Partners*, and enter your mail address in the *Sign-in* pop-up window.




- 7- **You finished your registration!** Now you can complete some information on your profile. Fields with exclamation marks are *Required* and must be filled to proceed. Once done, scroll down until the bottom of the page and click the blue button *Update Profile*


8- Your profile page will appear as below with your First and Last names entered previously.



9- Now that you have your profile, you will be able to access the JRA Online training module. To do so, click the **LEARN** tab at the top of the webpage (red square), and once the new window appear select the learning program entitled **TOOLS AND RESOURCES FOR A ONE HEALTH APPROACH** circled on the screen capture.



10- A new screen with two courses will appear. Select the course **The Joint Risk Assessment (JRA OT): A Training for Implementers**



11- The JRA course page will open. Click the blue button *Enrol me* down the page to access the course.

Zoonotic diseases, classified as either endemic or emerging, pose risks to both animal and public health. Activities to identify, assess, manage and reduce risks from zoonotic diseases benefit from coordination and collaboration between ministries.

The Joint Risk Assessment (JRA) Operational Tools (OT) was developed by the Tripartite organizations – the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), the World Organisation of Animal Health (OIE), and the World Health Organization (WHO)– and technical experts, to provide guidance on how to set up a joint qualitative risk assessment process at the national and subnational levels.

In this training, participants will explore the step-by-step process for setting up the JRA, conducting the technical risk assessment, and translating results to risk management options and communication needs. The JRA OT allows decision-makers to build and implement science-based risk management measures that are aligned between sectors and implemented jointly.

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
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


TIP: Some internet browsers may have restrictions on pop-up window in their settings and will not allow the new window of step 14 to appear. If on **Google Chrome**, you can click the little icon (red arrow) at the end of the URL tab to allow for pop-up window on the WHO website. Then refresh the webpage (button circled in red), and the window of your course will appear, as shown in step 14.



If on **Internet Explorer**: click the settings icon  > *internet options* > *Privacy* tab > untick the box *Turn on pop-blocker* > click apply > Refresh. You can turn back the pop-up blocker after the course, or modify the settings to only allow WHO website.
