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PURPOSE

1.1 OVERVIEW

Since 2015, the **World Health Organisation** (WHO) had had a mandate to lead the response to emergencies in which public health is the primary issue of concern. WHO therefore created the **WHO Health Emergencies** (WHE) programme for this purpose and today, the programme is involved in all aspects of:

- **Preparing** WHO's member states for the occurrence of a public health emergency.
- **Preventing** public health emergencies.
- **Responding** to public health emergencies when they occur.
- Assisting member states to recover from a public health crisis.

The IHR (2005) requires all States Parties to detect, assess, report, and respond to potential public health emergencies of international concern (PHEIC) at all levels of government, and to report such events rapidly to the WHO to determine whether a coordinated, global response is required. To develop baseline capacities of Member States, the WHA resolution "WHA 69.21" identified WHO's critical convening role to facilitate strategic cooperation and partnership between and within States Parties along with regional and internationals partners, donors and networks. The **Multisectoral Engagement for Health Security (MHS)** Unit is designed specifically to foster these relationships. MHS actively coordinates, convenes, monitors and maintains collaboration to ensure that relevant information from countries, partners and donors is shared in a timely manner. The SPH provides opportunities for multi-sectoral partnerships, collaboration and capacity-strengthening.

The resource mapping tool (REMAP) shows WHO Member States what resources exist for activities that contribute to the implementation of national health security plans. The tool maps health security projects that partners are supporting within the country, allowing policymakers, donors and partners to identify gaps and where investment of financial and technical resources is needed. The tool is also used to identify country needs for technical assistance in implementing National Action Plan for Health Security (NAPHS).

REMAP is also a monitoring tool that countries use to track progress in completing the activities required to implement their national health security plans.

Countries have requested a web-based alternative to the existing Excel-based REMAP tool. Users often have difficulty with Excel and prefer web-based data entry. A web-based version also allows for enhanced visualization and real-time access to the tool by WHO, the country focal points, donors, partners, and other designated users.

The purpose of this document is to describe the features of REMAP web tool. It is divided in 5 sections, that describe the main areas of the platform: NAPHS Implementation Dashboard, Financial Needs, Partner Details, Technical Areas in Need of Investment, and the Data Forms.

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1. NAPHS IMPLEMENTATION DASHBOARD

The NAPHS dashboard provides an overview into the current status of NAPH implementation for each Country. It has several components that are described in the following sections.

This section shows the overall progress of NAPHS Implementation. On the right-hand the breakdown per IHR Category is displayed.

On click on the arrow at the top the user is redirected to the details page where they can see the breakdown per Technical Area:

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For each Technical Area, the progress is the average of the Percentage of Achievement for each NAPHS activity for that Technical Area (the value entered in the Percentage of Achievement field in the NAPHS Activities Data Form).

Accordingly, the progress for each IHR Category is the average of the progress of the corresponding Technical Areas; and the overall NAPHS implementation progress is the average of the progress for all IHR Categories.

1.4.2. PRIORITIZED NAPHS ACTIVITIES



Similar to the NAPHS Implementation section described above, here the user can see the progress towards NAPHS Implementation for the Prioritized NAPHS Activities. Note that these activities are the ones marked as Prioritized in the NAPHS Data Form (see the NAPHS Activities Data Form chapter).
