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#### **About**

The COVID-19 pandemic has had a major impact on noncommunicable disease (NCD) control around the world. Many NCDs are themselves risk factors for more severe cases of COVID-19, putting current patients at greater risk. At the same time, health services have struggled under a double burden of COVID and non-COVID health needs.

Nowhere have the effects of the pandemic been felt more strongly than in cities. Local health system capacity has been severely strained, and the pandemic has put people's health at risk far beyond COVID-19. At the same time, it has created opportunities for changing current practice and exploring new ideas to promote better health in cities. It has also fostered strong collaboration between cities within existing networks.

How have cities addressed these issues, and what are the implications for urban health in the future? Join us as we explore key learnings on protecting citizens from NCDs during a global pandemic.
